## **Limited Production And Processing Definition**

Barriques coffee bean roasting operation at 961 South Park Street should not be considered "limited production and processing" as the full hours of the various tasks that take place each day involve preparation of product for roasting as well as packaging and storage of product throughout the day and up to the end of the day resulting in multiple employees working a full 8 hours a day 5 days a week to support the coffee bean roasting operation. The actual time frame of the roasting process is about 6 hours a day for 5 days a week. I do not see how Barriques coffee roasting can meet the definition of "limited production and processing". See definition below from the Chapter 28 Zoning Code:

"Limited Production and Processing.

Uses that produce minimal off-site impacts due to their limited nature and scale, are compatible with office, retail and service uses, and may include wholesale and off-premises sales."

I do not see where Barriques coffee roasting can be considered limited production and processing. The off-site impacts are not minimal. There is nothing limited about a production and processing operation that lasts 8 hours a day; five days a week for 260 days a year. That is the definition of full time work hours.

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
