Re: Proposed Street Reconstruction & Public Hearing

The City of Madison is planning a 2021 construction project for Starkweather Drive. The proposed project will include street improvements, sanitary sewer main and lateral replacements, and storm sewer replacements. Enclosed with this letter is a fact sheet with some details on the proposed project, which includes a map of the proposed project limits. Also enclosed is a notification for the Public Hearing before the Board of Public Works. The public hearing will be held virtually on **Wednesday, December 16, 2020 at 5:30PM**. Please see instructions for attending on the included hearing notice.

This project will involve special assessments to the owners of property adjacent to the project. The property owners will be assessed for various items included with this proposed project, and the costs of some of those items are assessed entirely to the owner. A table detailing the City's standard assessment policy for the items of work is included on the fact sheet.

Also enclosed is a Schedule of Assessments, which shows the estimated costs for each property adjacent to the project. After the work is complete, a final assessment will be calculated based on bid prices and work actually performed. The final assessment, which will be billed after the completion of the project, is payable in one lump sum or over a period of 8 years, with 2% interest charged on the unpaid balance.

That special assessments may be paid over an eight (8) year period, with the owner paying 1/8 of the principal each year plus two (2%) percent interest on the unpaid balance, as determined by the Board of Public Works.

That if the total assessment is paid in full before October 31st in the year that the billing is made, irrespective of project completion, then no interest shall be charged.

# Fact and Details Sheet: Starkweather Drive Assessment District - 2021

# **Project Details – Proposed Work**

Street: The City will reconstruct Starkweather Dr from Hargrove St to Dawes St as a one-way northbound street. The existing street width will be narrowed from 32 feet wide to 14 feet wide (face of curb to face of curb). The City will replace the roadway base and asphalt pavement along Starkweather Dr and at each intersection between Hargrove St and Dawes St. All curb and gutter and driveway aprons will be replaced along Starkweather Dr (assessable). Sidewalk will be replaced as needed (assessable) and sidewalk ramps will be updated throughout the project area.

Sanitary Sewer: The City will replace the existing sanitary main along Starkweather Dr (installed 1948) from Hargrove St to Dawes St. The City will also replace sanitary laterals from the new main to the property line. In limited cases where the existing lateral is cast iron, appears to be in good condition upon inspection, and runs under a tree, the lateral will only be replaced to the back of curb. In those cases, the owner will not be assessed for the additional footage of replacement that is not completed. If you would like a full lateral replacement to the property line in cases such as this, please contact the Sanitary Sewer Contact listed at right. (laterals assessable).

Water Main: No water main work is planned with this project.

**Storm Sewer:** The City will replace existing storm sewer inlets, structures, and storm sewer pipe (installed 1951-1961) along Starkweather Dr from Hargrove St to Dawes St. If you are aware of any existing private storm sewer or private connections (either to the curb or to a structure) from your property, please contact the Storm Sewer contact listed at right (private connections assessable).

Did you experience flooding near your property, or witness flooded public areas such as a street, park, bike path, or greenway? We would like to hear from you. 
**Terrace Areas:** Existing concrete terrace walkways and concrete stairs will be replaced with the project (assessable), unless the property owner requests that they are removed. Owners must remove any encroaching plantings, structures of

they are removed. Owners must remove any encroaching plantings, structures or special landscaping features from the terrace area and public right-of-way, prior to the start of construction, including raised planting beds, stone landscaping, retaining walls, railings, pavers, planters, etc. If left in place, these items will be removed by the contractor. The contractor will not replace these items following completion of the project.

Trees: No tree removals are anticipated with this project. Additional info regarding trees can be found on the reverse.

Bus pads: No bus pads are affected or will be installed with this project

Street Lights: No street lighting work is planned with this project.

Assessments: After construction is complete, the assessments are recalculated based on the bid prices and measured quantities. The final assessments are mailed in the summer of 2022. Property owners can pay the assessments in a lump sum or over 8 years with 2% interest.

# **Construction Schedule & Impacts**

Tentative Schedule: Early May 2021 - Late August 2021

**Traffic Impacts:** The streets will be closed to through traffic within the project limits, but will be open to local traffic (residents). No parking will be allowed during the day for the project duration, however, overnight parking (outside of work hours) will be available to local traffic, when possible. Residential driveways may be closed for up to 21 days. Residents will be given advanced notice when access to driveways will be restricted.

**Water Shut-offs:** No water shut-offs are planned with this project. Emergency shut-offs may occur if the existing water main is damaged during construction and any affected properties will be notified as soon as possible.

**Refuse Collection:** It will be the contractor's responsibility to allow for refuse collection to continue during construction. Please mark your address on your cart to make sure it is returned if moved. Have your cart out by 5am on day of pick-up or put out the night before collection. Normal operation of brush pickup and large item pickup will try to be accommodated as normal. These services may be temporarily interrupted depending on the status of work and ability for equipment to access necessary areas.

# **Supplemental Forestry Information**

Tree pruning in advance of the project is required to reduce the risk of damage to the trees during construction. The City of Madison Forestry Section will perform the necessary work. For certain species, especially oak and elm trees, the pruning must be completed by April 1st to reduce the chance of disease. If additional trees need to be removed, City Engineering will notify the adjacent property owner prior to removal.

Street trees provide many benefits to our city and are considered an important part of the city's infrastructure. Forestry Section staff will evaluate the terrace for new planting sites and potential replacement sites when the project is complete. There is no additional cost to the adjacent property owner for a tree planting. Street trees are typically planted in the spring of the year following the completion of the construction project. Per Madison General Ordinance 10.10, City Forestry determines tree species and planting locations. Residents cannot choose or plant their own tree in the terrace.
