



2022 Traffic Enforcement Goals

- 5. Respond to Community Member Complaints




Traffic Grant Corridors / High Injury Network

 - 3.6% of all citations and warnings issued city-wide in 4th Quarter




Citations and Warnings 2017 – Present City-Wide





Citations and Warnings 2017 – Present City-Wide





Traffic Grants

- The Madison Police Department, in partnership with the Dane County Sheriff's Office, conduct extra patrols that, depending on the time of year, focus on enforcing Wisconsin's alcohol, seatbelt, and speed laws.
- These additional enforcement efforts are made possible through traffic overtime grants provided by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.
- The goal of these extra patrols is not only to enhance public safety, but to prevent needless tragedies.
- Traffic grant activity is not confined to just the High Injury Network.



Traffic Grants

- All alcohol grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday
- 50% of seatbelt grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m.
- In addition to the grants, the Madison Police Department participates in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" and "Click It or Ticket" campaigns.
- The City of Madison also manages our own Pedestrian/Bike grants that are funded by the State of Wisconsin DOT.


Fatality Crashes

- The City of Madison had a total of 14 fatality crashes in 2022 the same number of fatality crashes as in 2021.
- Three of the fatality crashes occurred on the Beltline; Two occurred on Mineral Point Road.
- Four fatality crashes occurred in the 4th Quarter of the year.
- The following four slides summarize each of those four crashes.



- Date: 10/02/2022
- Time: 7:17 PM
- Location: Hwy 12/Hwy 14
- Type: Single Vehicle Motorcycle
- Motorcyclist was negotiating the exit ramp from EB Beltline to SB Hwy 14. Motorcyclist lost control and crashed.
- Causative Factors: Impaired Driving (suspected)




- Date: 10/11/2022
- Time: 6:39 p.m.
- Location: Mineral Point Road and High Point Road
- Type: MV vs Pedestrian
- Summary: Vehicle traveling WB on Mineral Point Road took a left turn onto High Point Road and struck a pedestrian who was walking WB while crossing High Point Road in the crosswalk. No evidence of criminal behavior; No prosecution per DA's Office.
- Causative Factors: Weather (raining), dark clothing (pedestrian), time of day (dark)


- Date: 10/27/2022

- Location: John Nolen Drive and North Shore Drive
- Type: MV vs. Bike
- Summary: The bicyclist started to cross John Nolen Drive, even though there was a no walk sign. The involved driver, who was traveling at a high rate of speed on inbound John Nolen Drive, sped up and drove through the red light at the intersection. The bicyclist struck the side of the truck as it passed through the intersection.
- Causative Factors: Speed (driver), Failure to Obey Traffic Signals (driver and bicyclist)






- Date: 12/04/2022

- Type: Single MV Crash
- Summary: The driver of the involved vehicle lost control, possibly due to speed, causing the car to leave the roadway, hit an electric pole and burst into flames.
- Causative Factors: Speed




Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes





Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes






School Zone Safety

- The City of Madison Police Department's Traffic Enforcement and Safety Team (TEST) made school safety a priority in 2022.
- Every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, TEST officers begin their day at specific schools listed on the school rotation calendar.
- On Mondays and Fridays TEST officers focus on issues in their respective districts. However, TEST officers also respond to schools and school zone complaints in their respective districts as a part of their morning routine.
- In addition to providing a high-visibility presence to deter unsafe driving and enforcing school zone violations they observe, TEST officers work with the schools, bus drivers, and crossing guards to address specific, chronic issues.
- TEST members work closely with Traffic Engineering if and when signage is needed to improve school zone safety.
