## **SUMMARY:**

At its meeting of December 19, 2012, the Urban Design Commission **RECOMMENDED APPROVED** the Charter ordinance. The Secretary stated that the City has allowed specific types of signage that exists in the right-of-way, but there is an issue with street graphics in the highway right-of-way as already allowed by the Sign Control Ordinance; this ordinance legitimizes what the City has been doing since the beginning of the sign ordinance. Rummel recalled that the Library was allowed to not follow City ordinance to allow them to go into the right-of-way; this ordinance would address municipal as well as private signage.

## **ACTION**:
