18625 FACTS

- One every 3 adults in WI is either a binge drinker or a chronic drinker
- WI is also high in the nation for underage drinking and drunk driving
- WI has one alcohol outlet for every 172 people and the national average is 1 every 1,400 people - WI has 9 times the national average
- Availability of alcohol beverages has a direct causal effect on the level of alcohol consumption in the population
- There is reasonable statistical evidence showing that government policies restricting the retail availability of alcoholic beverages will reduce the per capita rates of alcohol consumption in that population

HOW MUCH IS TOO MUCH?

- The National Institute of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) recommends that people taking prescription or over the counter medications that can interact with alcohol do not drink at all
- Many medications can interact with alcohol leading to increase risk of illness, injury or death. It is estimated that alcohol-medication interactions may be a factor in at least 25% of all emergency room admissions in any given population
- The NIAAA also recommends that women who are pregnant or may become pregnant should not drink at all
- WI leads the nation in the rate of alcohol use during pregnancy (30%) and 1 in 4,300 babies born in WI are affected with FAS
- 70% of the clients who shop at this establishment are women

ADDICTIONS PERSPECTIVE

- The three top recommendations for successful alcohol treatment are: 1) stay away from alcohol by changing your lifestyle, 2) learn to manage your urges to drink alcohol and 3) follow your treatment plan
- Drug stores are establishments associated with health and recovery
- Having alcohol available for purchase in drug stores is not helping the 1/3rd of the WI population who wants to control their urges by staying away from alcohol

NEIGHBOR PERSPECTIVE

- More alcohol sales sites in a neighborhood equates to more violence, and the highest assault rates are associated with carry-out sites selling alcohol for off-premises consumption
- In the last 10 years, the police sectors where 2 of these establishments are located have at least doubled the number of alcohol outlets and almost double the number of calls for service
