RE: Segredo Demerit Point Determination

Segredo is before you for a point determination based upon a complaint that was filed in April 2019 for incidents which occurred in November 2018 and February 2019. As part of a plea negotiation, Segredo pled to one count of "unlawfully permit an intoxicated person to be on the premises" and agreed to pay a forfeiture in the amount of three hundred and seventy six dollars (\$376.00). It is my understanding that counts two through four in the complaint resulted in the termination of employees involved. The complaint is attached for your information. An inquiry by the ALRC regarding Segredo's practice of allowing employees to consume alcohol while on duty would be appropriate.

Segredo has not been prosecuted for liquor license violations for the past several years and has not been a significant issue for Madison Police for the past several years. Segredo has, with some protest, agreed to the recent conditions imposed on liquor licenses in the 500 Block of University Avenue.

The incident to which Segredo entered a plea occurred on February 9, 2019. The maximum demerit point assessment for this violation is 10. Demerit points count against an establishment for a period of one year from the date of violation. I have no recommendation regarding the point determination.
