I generally support the project, as a needed improvement to a troubled section of my neighborhood that has too many empty buildings and sketchy behavior. While I realize it may seem counter-intuitive to grant an alcohol license for the purpose of neighborhood improvement (compared to a community center or a police station), I believe this is the most effective and efficient plan going forward to bring a steady level of organized and community-positive behavior, to everyone's benefit. The alcohol-portion of the club will allow the club partners (and my neighbors) to have the funding resources to achieve many other community goals & dreams; an empty building is merely a potential danger.
