PILOT PROGRAMS 2021 - 2023

Carts in Parks 2021

- \$50,000 NACTO Grant
- > Team City: Department of Planning, Community Development & Economic Development, Traffic Engineering, Parks
- \$20,000 guaranteed sales program (up to \$500/shift)
- \$30,000 LCC community markets @ Penn Park

\$50,000 ARPA/SBER FUNDS

Carts in Parks 2.0

2022

- Economic Development Division & Parks Division
- \$30,000 budgeted for guaranteed sales program
 - used \$12,829.40
 - Up to \$350/shift
- > \$20,000 budgeted for Parks Alive food stipends

Carts in Parks 3.0 No funds or grants

- 2023
- Cost to the City = staff time
- Collect real world data; not in "recovery" mode still
- > Continue to connect food vendors to community events and offer daily vending locations.
- When to Work software ~\$200 annual cost

LESSONS LEARNED

- Carts in Parks is a benefit to the City of Madison, as it offers opportunities for food vendors to do business and adds value to Community Events.
- ➤Carts in Parks supported food opportunities at Parks Alive & City sponsored events.
- Community Events connecting food vendor with organizer = better communication, less confusion approved vending fee waiver for food carts in the Neighborhood and Community Event permit fee structure will make the process more efficient.
- Daily Vending offering an app to sign up for shifts is best way to manage scheduling food carts
- >Food vendors might need to adjust menus to fit with the size and type of event.
- >Food vendor capacity varies due to staffing, mechanical/other issues, and other events.
- Communication Need a communication plan on event day for any unexpected issues
- Still opportunities to work with activated athletic fields and other park uses. CITY OF MADISON WISCONSIN

ONGOING PROGRAM

Main Focus for Carts in Parks – ONGOING PROGRAM

Daily Vending:

- Waive annual vending fees for City licensed food carts that sign up for and schedule locations through the program
 - > Specific locations / hours as determined by Parks Division staff each year.
 - > Continuing to support City Sponsored Events through the When to Work app
 - Continue to assess opportunities related to athletic field reservations and other activated park uses

*Requesting exclusive use of a location not permitted through the Carts in Parks program

No longer part of Carts in Parks

> Qualifying Community and Neighborhood Park Events:

No longer part of Carts in Parks with the food vendor fees waived for all qualifying events as part of the permit fee structure.
