# RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT -RECESSED PUBLIC HEARING

The Plan Commission recommended approval of the zoning map amendment subject to the comments and conditions contained in the Plan Commission materials and following conditions:

- That the renovation of the original 1946 hotel tower be conducted in accordance with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation (of historic buildings) and as approved by the State of Wisconsin Historic Preservation Office (SHPO);
- That condition #14 of the Plan Commission report be revised as follows: "That a revised Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan be submitted for approval by the City Traffic Engineer and Director of the Planning Division prior to final signoff of the planned unit development and issuance of building permits. The revised TDM should further elaborate on the strategies the developer will use to reduce automobile trips and increase alternative modal share, particularly for hotel employees. The TDM should include measures to set price signals (parking cash-out or direct subsidies, etc.), transit assistance, and other incentives to employees.

An earlier motion made by Olson, seconded by Bowser, to recommended approval of the zoning map amendment subject to the comments and conditions contained in the Plan Commission materials and a condition requiring the removal of two full stories of the new hotel tower. In making the motion, Olson noted that she did not believe the project met criteria of approval #1a for planned unit development. Bowser noted that she felt the project would be more in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan with two fewer stories. The motion failed on a 2-6 vote by the following: AYE: Olson, Bowser; NAY: Ald.
