- (5) <u>Granting or Denying an Application.</u> Within sixty (60) days of a completeness finding under <u>Sec. 41.17</u>(2), the Preservation Planner or Landmarks Commission shall, based upon the applicable standards in <u>Sec. 41.18</u>, approve, <u>approve with conditions</u>, or deny the application for certificate of appropriateness. Failure to approve or deny an application within sixty (60) days of a completeness finding shall be deemed a denial of the application, effective on the last day of the determination period. The determination period may be extended an additional sixty (60) days with the applicant's written agreement.
- (8) Meeting Conditions of Approval. Upon conditional approval of a project by the Landmarks Commission, the applicant shall have one (1) year to meet the conditions of approval in order to secure the Certificate of Appropriateness.
