This project is comprehensive hazardous materials removal from the Madison Municipal Building (a National Register Historic Property) including, but not limited to, floor and ceiling mastics, pipe fittings, fire doors, boiler breaching and insulation. This hazardous material removal is scheduled to be substantially removed prior to a comprehensive renovation of the Madison Municipal Building scheduled for 2017 through 2018.

Estimated cost of this project is \$270,000.

This project is to extensively renovate the Madison Municipal Building (a National Register Historic Property). The City's intended remodel and renovation scope is comprehensive and includes, but is not limited to, complete replacement of the HVAC/electrical/plumbing systems; added sprinkler system; roof replacement, and preservation of exterior historic masonry/mortar/windows; interior architectural remodel, and interior architectural preservation. Once complete the Madison Municipal Building is scheduled to house the Planning, Community, and Economic Development Divisions; Traffic Engineering and Parking Utility; Human Resources; Madison Credit Union; and extensive meeting space for staff, public, and elected officials.

Estimated cost of this project is \$22,500,000.
