My wife and I are new to the area, moving here from out of state in October,'21. To the point: in January I was informed of a virtual meeting about the neighborhood, learning of the street project. Expecting more from this great city, I learned from Mr. Wolf, leader of the project, about how efficient the operation was, and felt passive as I listened to everything, with little opportunity for public comment. I did respond in disappointment. Since then there have been many meetings, and I have spoken at each one. With winter and covid, there has been little opportunity to meet neighbors, yet the disapproval of the neighborhood seems great. I can only speak for myself. I disapprove because I feel bullied by the information: construction information about which I know little, and project information which concerns me little; and then little information about what really concerns me - the quality of our water (full of salt and chlorine), the environmental health of the lake across the street, and the historical importance of this unique location, a home for member of the Ho Chunk American Indian nation.

I am writing to slow the urgency of this operation. More of our neighborhood concerns need to be addressed. My neighbors have signs opposing this project. Please listen to us, in a spirit of cooperation.
