


Glacier Hill Park

Park Development Plan Summary

Introduction

Glacier Hill Park is part of the City of Madison's northeast planning area. It was aquired through a series of park dedications included in plat documents from 1994-2002. The park has been in its current configuration since 2019.

Existing Facilities

Existing park facilities include a playground, basketball court (full-court), drinking fountain, sun shelter, reservable multi-use fields, and paved path.

Proposed Facilities

This plan does not propose new locations for any existing park features. Existing amenities should be kept on typical maintenance and replacement schedules.

This plan does propose a few new amenities. First, an extention of the paved path from the center of the park to Bultman Rd. This path was explored as part of the planning process for the sun shelter, but was ultimately not included due to neighborhood feedback. Second, recreational biking and a bicycle playground is proposed to the south of the existing shelter (MadBAT recommendation). Lastly, managed meadow areas are proposed along Golden Leaf Trl to decrease the amount of mowing necessary and provide habitat for animals and insects.

Special Conditions

6' wide MG&E gas main easement along south side of Esker Dr.
