The City of Madison is proposing to reconstruct the utilities and pavement along the above referenced streets in 2013. You are being sent this letter to notify you of a public hearing before the Board of Public Works regarding the project, at the above referenced date, time & location. City Engineering will make a short presentation at the meeting, followed by the public hearing. The project will involve special assessments to owners of property adjacent to the project. Attached to this letter is a Schedule of Assessments, which shows estimated costs for each property adjacent to the project.

The proposed project limits are as follows:

- N. Fairchild St. from W. Washington to W. Mifflin St.
- W. Mifflin St. from N. Fairchild to N. Henry St.

The proposed work on N. Fairchild Street is a complete replacement of the street infrastructure including new curb and gutter, pavement, driveway aprons, and sidewalk as necessary. The sanitary sewer and storm sewer were replaced in 2012, but the water main on N. Fairchild St. will be replaced with this project. Street/pedestrian lighting and street trees will also be installed. W. Mifflin Street will have new curb and gutter and sidewalk installed adjacent to the Madison Public Library, and pedestrian lighting and street trees will also be installed on W. Mifflin St. The project is scheduled to take place during the spring and summer of 2013 with a tentative start date of the end of March.

Street Improvements

The proposed street improvements include removing and replacing asphalt pavement, drive aprons and curb and gutter. Sidewalk adjacent to the street will be removed and replaced on an as needed basis, to repair any unsafe or damaged sections. The concrete terrace will be replaced to match into the new curb and gutter, and tree grates will be installed in the concrete terrace for planting of new street trees.

The City and the property owners adjoining the reconstruction will share the cost of the street improvements. The City shares the cost on a 50-50 basis with the property owners for removing and replacing the curb and gutter, drive aprons, sidewalk, and concrete terrace on previously improved streets. The City assumes the entire cost for the new asphalt pavement and tree grates. The City also assumes the cost for the curb and gutter and sidewalk ramps located at each street intersection. The property owner assumes 100% of the cost of pedestrian

street lighting. The attached Schedule of Assessments shows a breakdown of costs for each street reconstruction item and the total estimated cost to be assessed to each adjacent property owner. Sanitary Sewer and Storm Sewer

The sanitary sewer main and laterals and the storm sewer within the limits of this project were constructed with the utility project on N. Fairchild Ft. in 2012. If you have any questions related to that work, please contact the project engineer.

Water Main and Water Service Laterals

The water main will be replaced on N. Fairchild St. with the project. The existing water main on the street was installed in 1922. The City will abandon the old main that currently serves the properties and will connect all of the properties to the new water main. Property owners will not be assessed for the new water main. Please contact Dennis Cawley of the Madison Water Utility at 261-9243 with questions regarding the water main replacement.

Street Landscaping and Lighting

The proposed streetscape includes the addition of pedestrian street lighting and trees. All work is proposed to be in the street terrace.

The plan proposes adding pedestrian scale lighting poles to be consistent with other streets in the downtown area. The cost of the materials and installation is assessed to property owners. Thereafter, energy and maintenance are done at City cost. All wiring for lighting is underground. Two styles of pedestrian lights will be installed with this project. The style shown in the picture on the left is proposed for N. Fairchild St. and will be colored black. These will match the pedestrian lights installed on S. Fairchild St. in 2012 as well as on several other downtown streets. The picture on the right shows the style proposed for W. Mifflin St., which will match the pedestrian lights that were previously installed on W. Mifflin next to the Library.

Tree locations will be marked and installed throughout the project limits. It is anticipated that City Forestry will plant the planned trees in the fall of 2013. Any necessary removals of existing trees within the limits of this project have already taken place.

With the nature of this work, property owners should anticipate that most of the terrace will be disturbed, therefore, any plantings or special landscaping features

that an owner wishes to save from damage should be removed from the terrace area prior to the start of construction.

Special Assessments - General

A special assessment is a special charge for work that the City is planning to complete. The attached Schedule of Assessments shows an *estimate* of the property owners' share of the project costs based upon the City's assessment policy. After the project is bid, and work is complete, a final assessment will be calculated based on bid prices and work actually performed. The final assessment, which will be billed after the completion of the project, is payable in one lump sum or over a period of 8 years, with 3% interest charged on the unpaid balance.
