The City of Madison is proposing to reconstruct Highland Avenue and resurface Walnut Street in conjunction with a storm sewer improvement project in 2013. You are being sent this letter to notify you of a public hearing before the Board of Public Works regarding the reconstruction and resurfacing projects, at the above referenced date, time & location. City Engineering will make a short presentation at the meeting, followed by the public hearing. The project will involve special assessments to owners of property adjacent to the project. Attached to this letter is a Schedule of Assessments, which shows estimated costs for each property adjacent to the project.

The proposed project limits are:

- Reconstruction of Highland Avenue from University Avenue to Campus Drive.
- Resurfacing of Walnut Street from University Avenue to Campus Drive.

The proposed work on Highland Avenue will be a reconstruction project with complete street replacement including spot replacement of curb and gutter, storm sewer, drive aprons and sidewalk as needed. Walnut Street will be a resurfacing project with spot replacement of curb and gutter, storm sewer, drive aprons and sidewalk as needed. The project is scheduled to take place during spring and summer 2013 with a tentative start date of April 14<sup>th</sup>.

# Street Improvements

The proposed street improvements include removing the pavement and replacing it with new asphalt pavement. Spot replacing the curb and gutter, drive aprons and sidewalk as needed. The City and the property owners adjoining the projects will share the cost of the street improvements. The City shares the cost on a 50-50 basis with the property owners for removing and replacing the curb and gutter, drive aprons and sidewalk. The City assumes the entire cost for the new pavement and storm sewer improvements. The City also assumes the cost for curb and gutter and sidewalk ramps located at each street intersection. The attached Schedule of Assessments shows a breakdown of costs for each street reconstruction item and the total estimated cost to be assessed to each adjacent property owner. ### **Traffic Impacts, Storm Sewer Construction**

The street replacement and resurfacing projects will be occurring in conjunction with a larger storm installation. Between April 14th and August 14th, a 96-inch diameter storm sewer pipe will be installed between Highland Avenue and 2202 University Avenue for the purpose of reducing local and regional flooding. The pipe installation will occur via microtunneling, which means excavation will be limited to Highland Avenue, Walnut Street, and one eastbound lane of Campus Drive. Large pits will be dug in these locations to accommodate microtunneling equipment and pipe installation.

This project will cause significant impacts to traffic in the area. Walnut Street will be closed to vehicle traffic between April 14th and August 14th (approximately). Two lanes of Highland Avenue will be closed from May 19th through August

(approximately). Traffic on Highland Avenue will be reduced to one lane in each direction. Additionally, one eastbound lane of Campus Drive will be closed from April 14th through June 29th (approximately).

City Staff is holding a meeting to discuss the project and associated disruptions with businesses in the area. The project will be explained in detail and staff will be available to answer questions. The meeting will be held at the Inn Towner (2424 University Avenue) at 5::30pm on December 13<sup>th</sup>.

# Street Landscaping

During construction, it may be necessary to trim existing tree limbs and/or roots to accommodate the construction. Tree conflicts are often encountered with sanitary sewer lateral replacements. Tree roots that have caused sidewalk to heave will be cut back to allow construction of a level sidewalk. If, during the course of construction, it is determined that a tree must be removed, City Engineering will notify property owners adjacent to the tree to be removed, prior to removal.

With the nature of this work, property owners should anticipate that most of the terrace will be disturbed, therefore, any plantings or special landscaping features that an owner wishes to save from damage should be removed from the terrace area prior to the start of construction.

# Street Lighting

The plan proposes installing two pedestrian scale lighting poles in the east terrace on Highland Ave. The cost of the materials and installation is assessed to the property owner. Thereafter, energy and maintenance are done at City cost. All wiring for lighting is underground. # Special Assessments - General

A special assessment is a special charge for work that the City is planning to complete. The attached Schedule of Assessment's shows an estimate of the property owners' share of the project costs based upon the City's assessment policy. After the project is bid, and work is complete, a final assessment will be calculated based on bid prices and work actually performed. The final assessment, which will be billed after the completion of the project, is payable in one lump sum or over a period of 8 years, with 3% interest charged on the unpaid balance.
