Advantages to utilizing current contracts and existing programs:

(rather than creating new programs, systems and infrastructure)

- Programs have waiting lists and/or identified youth with barriers to employment, school deficiencies and other challenges
- Existing relationships with youth, families, MMSD and other youth service providers in the targeted neighborhoods
- Administrative infrastructure covered through existing City contracts
- Details regarding allowable activities, insurance and other issues specific to youth work in place and up-to-date
- Two programs have pre-existing approval for credit recovery with MMSD and/or H.S. diploma/GED
- Existing relationship between programs and City Parks and Streets Depts

Commonwealth Development (CWD)

- Recruit businesses to employ 15 additional youth for summer with the potential for on-going part-time employment
- Recruit 5 new businesses to join the current 54 employing youth through CWD
- Provide up to 23 hours of pre-employment and on-going mentoring support

- Youth serve on work crews full-time for 10 wks with projects in Madison Parks, Henry Vilas Zoo and MMSD
- Direct public works type impact
