



MUNICIPAL SILHOUETTE PROJECT

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To whom it may concern,

I am proposing a public sculpture/city utility project for the city of Madison, WI. My project combines formal craft with urban function in the form of recognizable objects. The objects I am referring to are the municipal and utilitarian fixtures that help compose our urban infrastructure and allow it to systematically function. Objects such as transformer boxes, post boxes, fire hydrants are extremely common and absorbed into our visual idea of what an urban space looks like, and yet they are seemingly forgettable and do not stand out. The objective of this proposed venture is to replicate these objects into what I refer to as “municipal silhouettes.” This entails building simple steel square stock armatures in the form of these utilitarian objects and acting as bicycle racks within the city.

This project idea has seen its initial start through a UW public sculpture initiative. This first armature depicts the frame and features of a traffic light box on UW campus and was placed relatively close to one of these actual objects in front of the UW engineering building. All components of the sculpture were welded together and constructed from steel square stock tubes or steel sheet metal. All of these municipal fixtures have distinct features such as the traffic light box's ventilated surface on its exterior hatch. These features would all be accentuated by placing them in seemingly non-existent surfaces like that of the ventilated grill on the first *Municipal Silhouette*. The proposed series of sculptural bike racks would be placed strategically around the city and would inhabit a space next to or near the municipal object it references. Due to the nature of the sculptures square stock construct and ample amount of enclosed negative space, bicyclists would easily be able to lock their bicycles to the sculptures' frames. For aesthetic purposes the sculptures will be painted metallic black to express shadow-like or projected qualities of the referenced objects within the city. Each sculpture will require a concrete foundation excavated into the terrain it will be placed and bolted into that foundation in order to prevent movement or jostling the bike rack. The series will consist of 7 to 10 pieces placed around the city with a reasonable budget. Each sculpture costs approximately \$100 to make considering the amount of it took to produce the prototype. With the additional cost of installing them, I am asking for \$1300.

I believe that these sculptures serve a dual purpose of poignantly referencing the outside world we interact with regularly as well as providing a civic service to a city that prides itself with its bicycle culture. It's a playful method of helping the public appreciate components of our visual world and to promote a healthy mode of transportation and recreation. I feel that my prior sculptural practice vouches for the type of proficiency needed for this type of project. My main artistic focus has been that of referencing urban and utilitarian design through means of recreating and appropriating these familiar objects. I would be delighted to blend my own personal interest in urban subject matter with a civic project that would be enjoyable and accessible to the entire population of Madison.

Budget

Production of steel sculptures: \$800-\$900

Installation cost of pouring concrete and faceting the objects: \$400
