SUBJECT: ID# 39140 State Street Mall /Capitol Concourse Vending Area Sidewalk Café fees Report

Mayor Soglin asked the Planning and Economic Development Teams to look at sidewalk café fees for the State Street Mall Capitol Concourse Vending Area (Mall /Concourse) in terms of both fees as compared to other cities, as well as the market value of the privatization of public space for private use. It is his intent that any increased revenue from sidewalk café fees should be used for such activities as improving the downtown pedestrian experience, additional support for Mall Maintenance, and creating/providing programming for State Street and the Capitol Square. These funds would be prioritized and authorized during the budget appropriations process.

A. <u>Issues regarding Madison's downtown sidewalk cafes:</u>

- 1. **Competition with retail** Once a space has been converted to a restaurant and/or bar, it will likely never return to a retail use:
 - Expensive kitchen conversions
 - Higher rent value per square foot for restaurants
 - Restaurant and retail chain stores often require larger footprints

2. Benefit to downtown:

- Sidewalk cafes add a great pedestrian atmosphere to the downtown.
- Cafes have added significant evening activity to State Street and the Capitol Square.
- Cafes promote positive downtown activity and promote local businesses.
- 3. **Crowded State Street:** Recent observations have shown the continued increase in sidewalk cafes have made the pedestrian zone more crowded, and have forced public amenities, such as bike racks, benches, etc into a smaller amount of space.



- 4. **Benefit to restaurants for a nominal fee:** Restaurants gain a large financial advantage from sidewalk café revenues, as well as visibility (advertising) for a comparably small permit fee.
 - The square footage gained by the sidewalk café is likely more profitable per square footage than indoor space:
 - 1. Back of house square footage (kitchen, restrooms etc) is already covered by original indoor rent
 - 2. No overhead costs (heat/water/electricity)
 - 3. Only non-labor costs are annual fees and the initial startup costs for the café furniture and barriers
- 5. Value of the privatization of public space for private use:
 - Currently, the City of Madison uses an approximation for value of land when determining rates for encroachment leases.
 - A sample of current real estate listings for retail /restaurants in the Mall /Concourse Vending Area:

1. 118 State Street restaurant: \$29/sq ft/yr
 2. 210 State St retail: \$27/ sq ft/ year
 3. 250 State St restaurant: \$45/ sq ft/ year

4. 341 State S retail (lower level): \$10-35/ sq ft /year1 (\$22.50 average)
5. 501 State St retail/rest. (Hub): \$45 retail /60 restaurant/ sq ft/ year
6. 502 State St retail (Towers): \$20-45/sq ft/ year (\$32.50 average)

506 State St retail: \$42/sq ft/ year
 508 State St retail: \$42/sq ft/ year

9. 510 State St retail: \$27-30/ sq ft/ year (\$28.50 average)

 10. 512 State St retail:
 \$29/ sq ft/ year

 11. 673 State St retail:
 \$45/ sq ft/ year

 12. 118 King St retail build to suit:
 \$18/ sq ft/ year

 13. 315 N Henry St retail:
 \$25/ sq ft / year

 14. 315 W Gorham retail:
 \$15/sq ft/ year

 15. 461 W Gilman St Bar/Rest.:
 \$38/ sq ft/ year

- Approximate average triple net annual rents from above sample:
 - 1. Retail = \$31/ sq ft/ year
 - 2. Restaurant = \$43/ sq ft/ year
- Sidewalk café season is roughly May-October (6 months) with the most active/profitable months being June-September (4 months)
 - 1. Divide the average restaurant triple net rate by 3 to equal the 4 months of most active seasonal use = \$43/3 = \$14.33
 - 2. To account for rain, special events and other factors, reducing that rate to \$13 / sq ft seems to be a reasonable valuation of the sidewalk café space.

B. <u>Current Fee Schedule, average café size, and location information:</u>

1. **Per chair Fee:** Madison currently charges \$35-45 per chair in annual fees depending upon café capacity.


a. 9 or fewer chairs: \$400 per year

b. 10-15 chairs: \$550 per year


c. 16-20 chairs: \$650 per year

d. 21+ chairs: \$750 per year

- 2. **Average Café Size: 250 square feet -** The attached Sidewalk Café Data Report illustrates that cafes range in size from 68 square feet (smallest) to 1088 Square feet (largest), the average café size is approximately 250 square feet.
- 3. Average Per square foot costs: approximately \$3 per square foot If the current chair system was approximately converted to a per square foot fee, the result is about \$3 per square foot.
- 4. **Location of Cafes:** The vast majority of sidewalk cafes occur within the State Street Mall/Capitol Concourse Vending Area, see map below. Cafes within this area are regulated differently than cafes located elsewhere in the city. Approximately 10-15 cafes exist outside of this area.



5. Configuration of cafes on State Street: On State Street, cafes currently occupy the approximately 12 foot flex zone between the curb and the 6 foot pedestrian zone. The Capitol Square has café configurations that depend largely upon existing planters, bus stops and other permanently installed street furniture.



C. Other examples of municipal sidewalk café fees:

Attachment 2 shows a wide range of different sidewalk cafes in different cities, however, the following cities could be considered most similar to the relationship of State Street to Madison's Downtown:

1. Buffalo, New York (Buffalo Place): \$1.30 / sq ft

2. Boulder, CO (Pearl Street): \$650 initial application fee + \$113

Charlottesville, VA (Downtown Mall): \$5 / sq ft
 Iowa City, IA (Pedestrian Mall): \$5 / sq ft
 Denver, CO (16th Street Mall): \$7 / sq ft

6. Santa Monica (Third Street Promenade): \$872 + \$3.27 per sq feet every 6 months

7. Miami Beach (Lincoln Road): \$20 / sq ft

8. New York City (Outer Boroughs i.e. Brooklyn): \$510 plus \$28 / sq ft (minimum \$1,800)

D. **Budget Implications:**

Increased fees would be incorporated into the general fund, however, it is the Mayor's intent that these funds be used for such activities as improving the downtown pedestrian experience, additional support for Mall Maintenance, and creating/providing programming for State Street and the Capitol Square. These funds would be prioritized and authorized during the budget appropriations process.

E. Proposal for Discussion

1. Citywide Cafes outside of the State Street Mall / Capitol Concourse Vending Area: Sidewalk café license fees for citywide cafés not located in the State Street Mall/Capitol Concourse Vending Area could be converted to a square foot value that is similar to the current fees. This value has been approximated to \$3.00 per square foot.

2. Cafes within the State Street Mall / Capitol Concourse Vending Area:

Sidewalk café license fees for cafés within the State Street Mall/Capitol Concourse Vending Area could have fees increased gradually to reflect the market value of the sidewalk space. Sidewalk cafes fees would increase to \$5 per square foot per year in 2016 and 2017, and begin paying \$13 per square foot in 2018. Any new cafes, not in operation in 2015 could begin paying the full \$13 per square foot at the creation of their café.

- A \$5 per square foot per year interim fee results in an increase of approximately \$500 for an average 22 chair, 250 square foot sidewalk café.
- A \$13 per square foot per year fee results in an increase of approximately \$2500 for an average 22 chair, 250 square foot sidewalk café.
