	Notes:	Ruth Rohlich, Economic Development Staff, was available to answer questions. She said that the grant program was based on the very successful Façade Grant Program, but targets interior spaces for retail users on State Street. There is a \$50,000 matching grant available to business owners that will be paid for using TID 32 funding. Rohlich mentioned that the program details are still being drafted and that they are at commissions to get input on the program specifications. Zellers noted that the word "forgivable" should be removed since the program is a grant and not a loan. Hirsch asked if this was allowable by TIF law using the "but for" test that usually accompanies TIF requests. Rohlich said that the "but for analysis" isn't included, and she would have to look into that issue. Verveer said that TID funds have been successfully used for other grant programs without running into legal issues. Rohlich added that the grants program will end when the TID closes. Mayer asked if the Gap could apply for funds. Rohlich explained the local business requirement, using guidelines from "Dane County's Buy Local" that is part of the program to avoid large chains being eligible. Rohlich said that \$300,000 was available for the first year. Verveer noted that the

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Mayor's budget has a different dollar amount in it for this program, so the fiscal note will have to

change to be correct. Torkildson said that this looks like a great program, but questions the large footprint of the eligible area. She said that staff should consider a more targeted area that could cluster retail into a smaller, but potentially more successful area. She said that staff could look at concentrating it to the middle blocks of State Street, for example. Carbine said that while clustering is good, she doesn't want to limit the potential good of this program to just one area, as there may be unexpected retail clusters that could be created. Crabb agrees with both Torkildson and Carbine and suggests that staff consider some sort of prioritization to the program that wouldn't necessary limit its potential. Resolution approving the State Street Retail District Improvement Grant Program.

Body

WHEREAS, the City of Madison continues to look for opportunities to preserve the unique character of the State Street and Downtown area; and

WHEREAS, successful independent retail businesses can have a significant effect on the attractiveness and marketability of and area; and

WHEREAS, Tax Increment District 32 continues to be a healthy and fiscally strong TID ; and

WHEREAS, additional approvals are needed to amend the TID32 project plan prior to launching the program; and

WHEREAS, providing an opportunity for independent retailers to move into the targeted area and invest in interior improvements that will benefit not only the current, but future retailers with the space is important to maintaining a strong downtown;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the program language and application are approved for use effective upon subsequent approval of amendments to the TID 32 project plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Economic Development staff is authorized to manage and market the program to current and future independent retails with operations in the targeted area that follow the approved program guidelines; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the each contract shall be approved by the Common Council at a later date.
