
Conceptual Approach

OFF THE WALL is a nighttime, outdoor screening series of contemporary video art founded by artists Simone Doing and Max Puchalsky in their capacity as Lead Curators at Arts + Literature Laboratory. The series aims to present a survey of the most compelling and innovative moving image works from a broad cross-section of artists—local to international, emerging to mid-career. In it's pilot year, OFF THE WALL 2016 featured works by 35 artists, selected out of 450 submissions from 50 countries. Works variously explored themes of internet culture, memory, language, identity, war, and the environment, through an equally diverse array of forms, including experimental documentary, stop-motion, video collage, 2D and 3D animation, and documentation of performance. This year, the series will double to four nights of programming, with screenings on each Saturday in August 2017, culminating in a family-friendly "best of" program at Hawthorne Library on the final night of the series.

Project Description (400 words or less)


After piloting the program last year to great success, we are seeking BLINK funding to run our video art screening series again this year, and expand it to four nights of unique programming on each Saturday in August. The first three screenings will take place in the brick alley adjacent to Arts + Literature Laboratory, and the fourth screening will take place on the back wall of Hawthorne Library. Greg Mickells, Director of Madison Public Library, has given us site-approval for the screening. We hope it will be a way to engage new audiences with contemporary moving image art as well as unveil the makeover of the space use behind the library. Each outdoor screening will be free to attend, open to the public, and ADA accessible.

Conceptualizing and organizing OFF THE WALL has been instrumental to developing our practice as Madison artists and curators, and we are proud that the project provides an opportunity for local artists to share the screen with national and international talent, as well as expose the local community to current developments in global contemporary art. BLINK funds will allow us to provide artist honoraria, as well as better promote and document the program through the production of a full-color printed program with image plates and artist notes.
