## 12.325 Entering or Staying Upon Highways Restricted - 6 Month Report SUBJECT:

City Ordinance 12.325 became effective April 10, 2017. During the first several weeks after the ordinance went into effect, Officers contacted those observed in violation of the ordinance and handed out the ordinance information pamphlets. The pamphlets explain the ordinance, the covered highways, and a list community resources available to those in need. Officers gave verbal warnings for the violation and educated violators by explaining the ordinance and handing out a pamphlet.

During the first six months the ordinance was in effect, eight persons were issued a total of 27 citations for violation of MGO Sec. 12.325. One individual has been cited 15 times. Four of those cited listed no permanent address on at least one of the occasions they were cited. The demographic information for those cited is listed below.
