Captain Ackeret from the Madison Police Department shared the Police Department's 2018 Operating Budget Proposal. He also shared an update on the departments recent violence reduction initiatives with using the Koper Curve Theory targeting "hot spots" around the city. Information that was shared during the meeting is attached to the minutes.

49078 Report from Alder Skidmore on the Westside Community Meeting.

Alder Skidmore shared information from the October 4 West Side public listening session. Key topics that were discussed during the listening session were on staffing levels, chapter 51 transports, officer stress, overtime costs, staffing, traffic enforcement, weapons violations, peer support/hyper vigilance, retirements, human trafficking with causes/solutions, surveillance with body-worn and fixed, and solutions to reduce violence.

A suggestion to encourage other Alders to host listening sessions within their districts was mentioned.

A discussion took place on alcohol licenses such as what is being considered when a license is issued and funding in the budget. The committee suggested alcohol licenses as a topic for discussion with possibly working with the Alcohol License Review Committee as it relates to Public Safety. The committee would like to have a joint meeting or discussion with ALRC in the future regarding this.
