President of the Park Commission

President Emily Gnam had no new information to share.

Superintendent of Parks

Assistant Superintendent Lisa Laschinger reported that parks continue to see heavy use. Staff are preparing for winter operations, including snow routes. Winter plans will focus on providing additional opportunities for outdoor recreation. There will be snow making at Elver through the continued partnership with Madison Nordic Ski Club and Central Cross Country Skiing. Staff plan to open previously existing ice rinks with the commitment of each Adopt Ice volunteer group.

A draft of the Park Event Ordinance will be shared with the commissioners at a future meeting, as well as be reviewed by the Facilities, Programs and Fees Subcommittee. The Vilas Park Master Plan has already received significant input and engagement.

Parks is ending the year at the budgeted levy amount due to reduced spending and open staff positions. The golf program had a very good year.

The Integrated Pest Management Taskforce has not met, but Parks has continued various initiatives. We are in the prescribed burn window and making good headway. Parks and other City agencies have collaborated to implement an art project that promotes physical distancing. Teen Night is being run once a week at the Warner Park shelter, with plans to expand to three nights a week and partner with the Mallards to use the Duck Blind in late November. The Olbrich Conservatory opening was well attended and received. The Parks Division provided support to the Clerk's Office for the November election.

Superintendent Eric Knepp spoke about the reality of a drop in services caused by budget challenges and staffing shortages.
