TO THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL:

RE: EXCESSIVE ASSESSMENT: Don M. Millis, Reinhart Boerner Van Deuren, SC, attorney for Monson Construction, – Excessive Assessment - \$23,619

Claimant Monson Construction is claiming a refund for excessive real property tax pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 74.37 for their 2023 taxes for their property located at 725 Heartland Trail. The claimant alleges that the assessed value should be no higher than \$1,964,854 for 2023, and the property taxes should be no higher than \$33,184. The Claimant seeks a refund of \$23,619 plus interest.

The City Assessor valued the property at \$3,355,600 for tax year 2023. The Claimant challenged the 2023 assessment before the Board of Assessors, and they increased the assessment to \$3,640,000. The Claimant then challenged the 2023 assessment before the Board of Review, and they reduced the assessment to \$3,363,300. The 2023 real property taxes were \$56,802.96. The Claimant also alleges that the assessed value of the property established by the Office of the Assessor and sustained by the Board of Review violates Article VIII, Section 1 (“Uniformity Clause”) of the Wisconsin Constitution.

I have consulted with the Office of the Assessor, and we are of the opinion that the Board of Review determined the appropriate assessed value for 2023.

For the foregoing reasons, I recommend denial of the subject claim.

NOTE: This claim was received on January 30, 2024, and pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 74.37(3)(a) if no action is taken on this claim by the Common Council within ninety (90) days of filing the claim, it is considered disallowed.
