



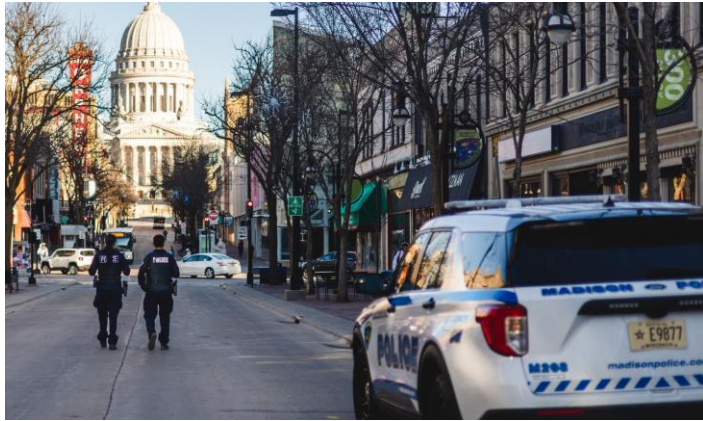

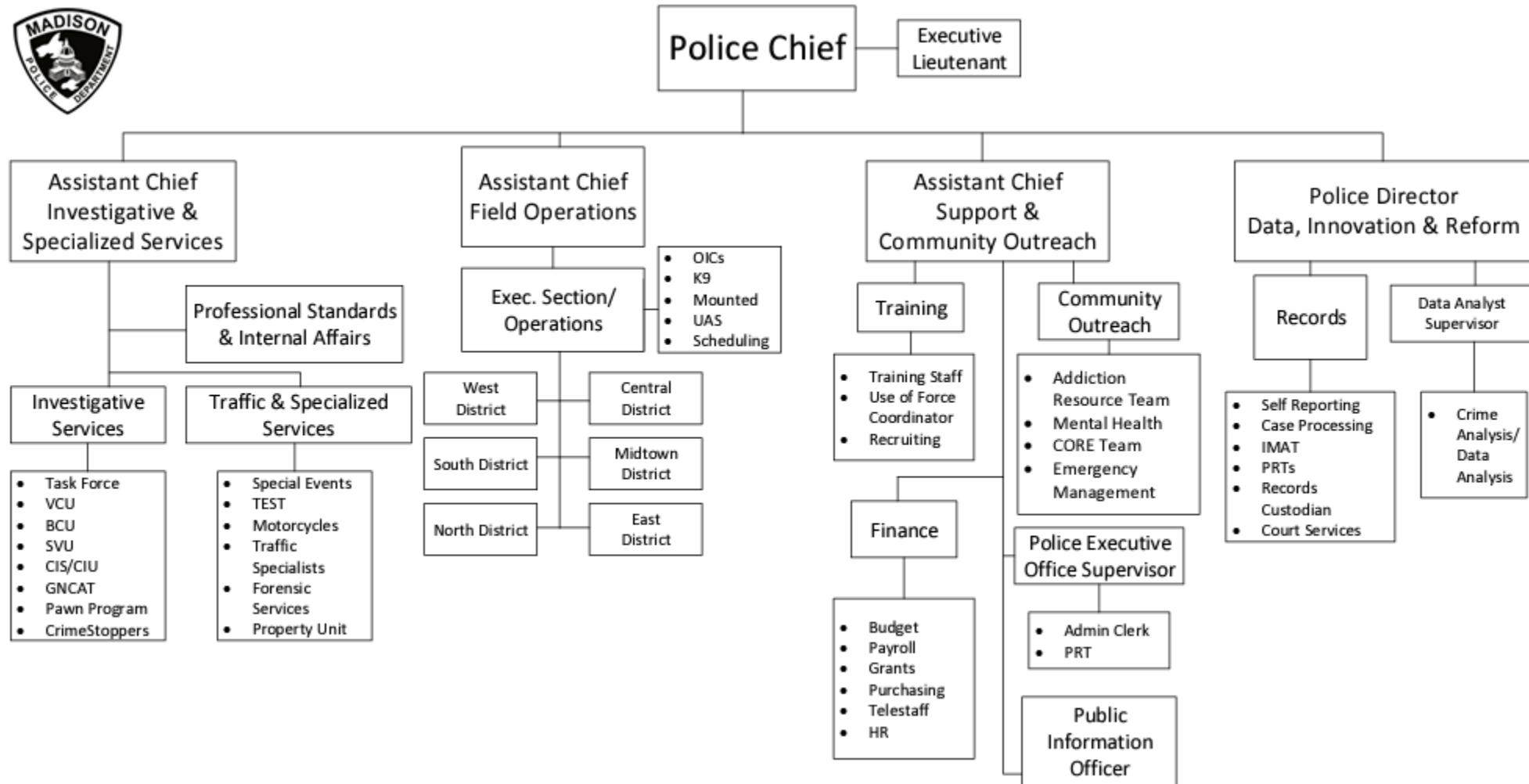

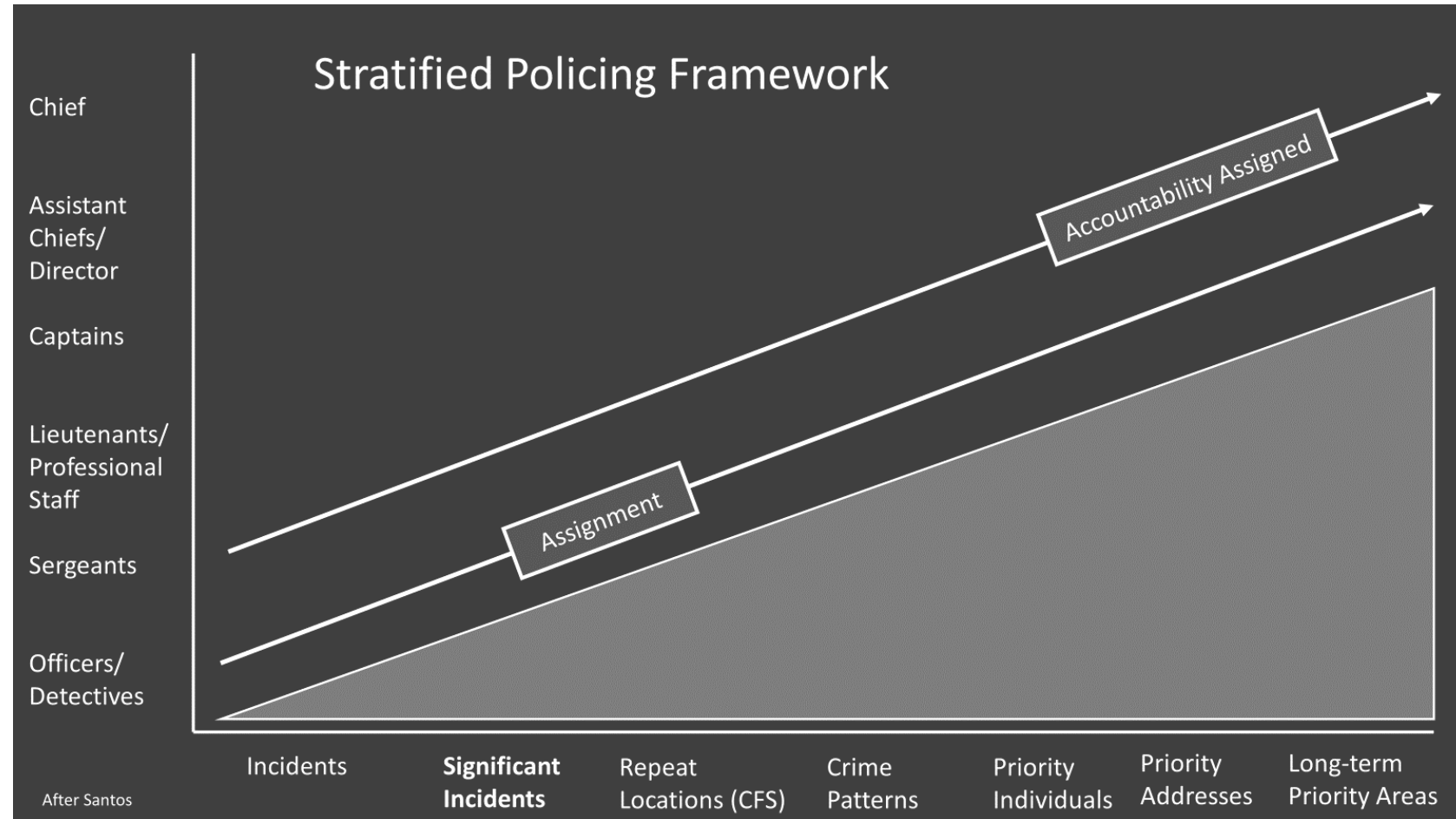

# Employee Safety and Wellness



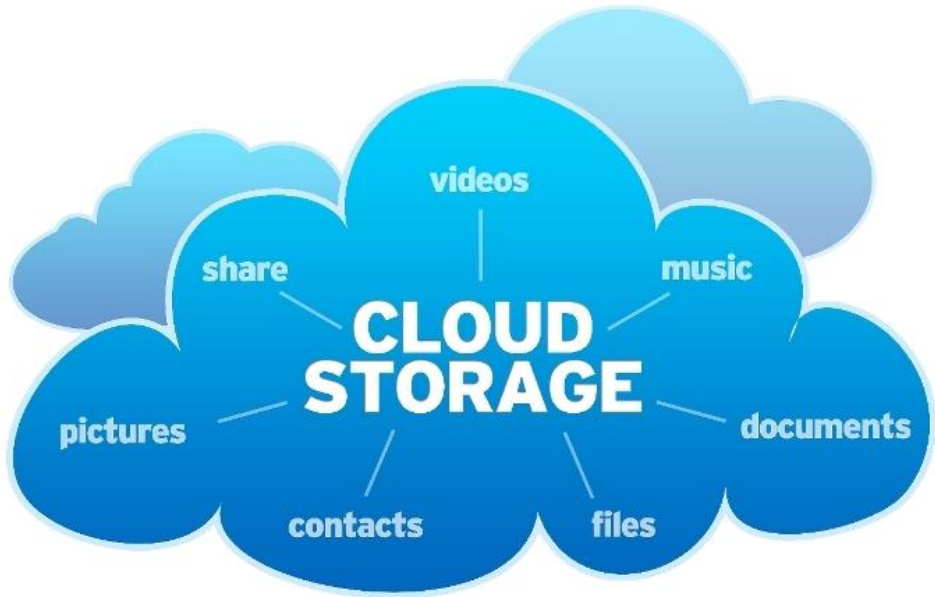
- Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE)
  - Additional classes were added to allow greater attendance by city employees
- Active Shooter Incident Management (ASIM)
  - All MPD and MFD personnel participated in joint response training
- Wellness Checks
  - Collaboration with EAP to improve the current process and experience







# Data, Innovation, and Reform



- Information Technology Cloud Projects
  - **Genetec/Clearance:** Migrating in-car video and interview room systems to the cloud, as well as implementing software for video redaction to reduce wait times for public records requests involving video.
  - **Scene Collect:** Moving digital evidence and law enforcement records to the cloud to streamline the evidence collection process, make it easier for officers to collect photos/documents from the field, and increase security of digital evidence.
- **3 Year Records Review Process (2023-2026)**
  - Reviewing older records that now fall outside of our retention schedule to ensure we are only retaining necessary case files (currently evaluating 1940's-1990's).
  - Once complete, all necessary records will be digitized.
  - We now have 15 fully electric, and 13 hybrid, cars added to our fleet.



# Investigative Services

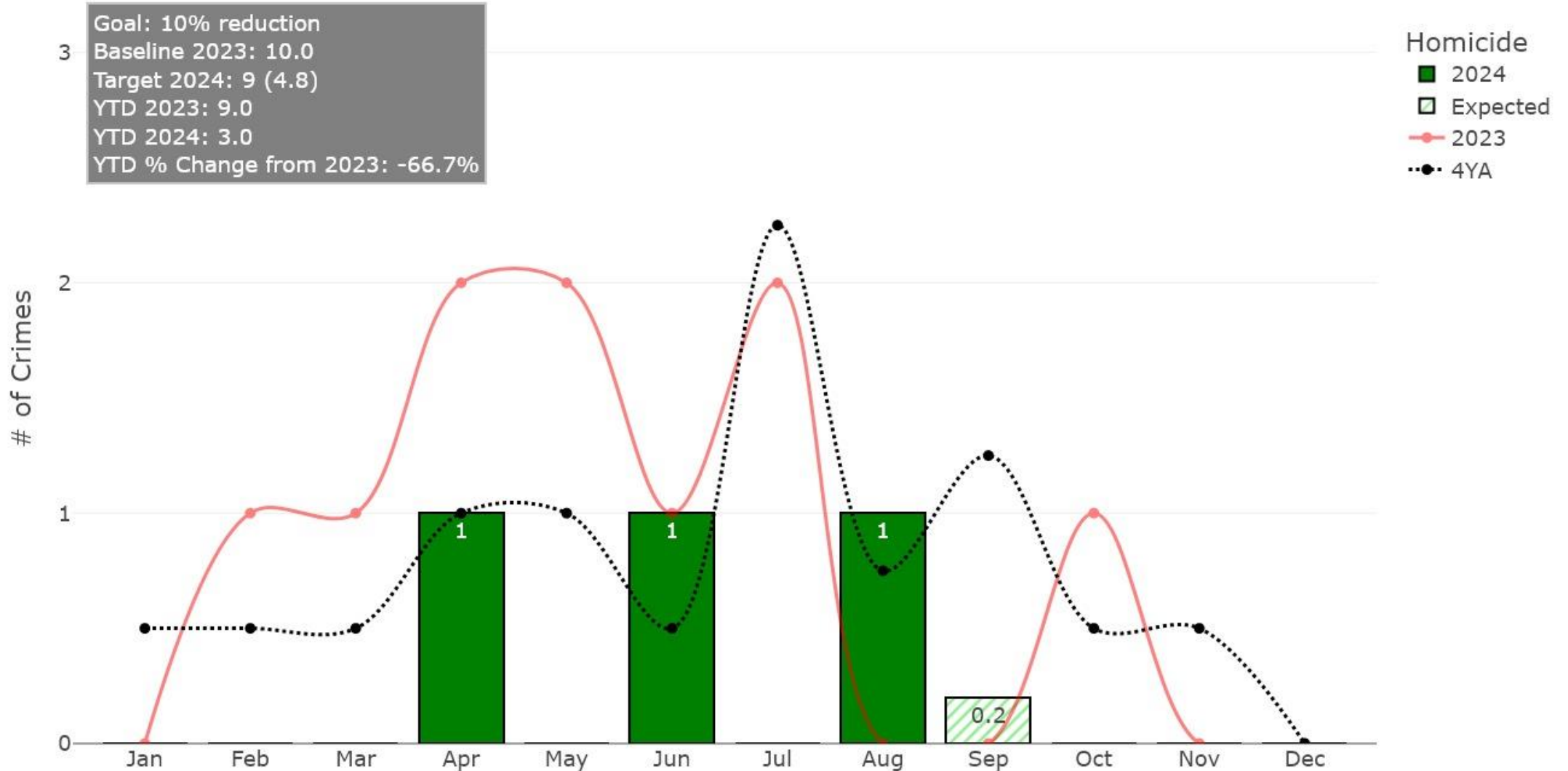
## Community Safety Intervention Team (CSIT)

- MPD's Violent Crime Unit (VCU) has continued to collaborate with PHMDC on a ***weekly basis*** to exchange information on violent weapons offenses in Madison.
- Mayor's **bi-weekly** violence prevention meeting.
- Restructuring of Investigative services to include a family justice and financial crimes unit.





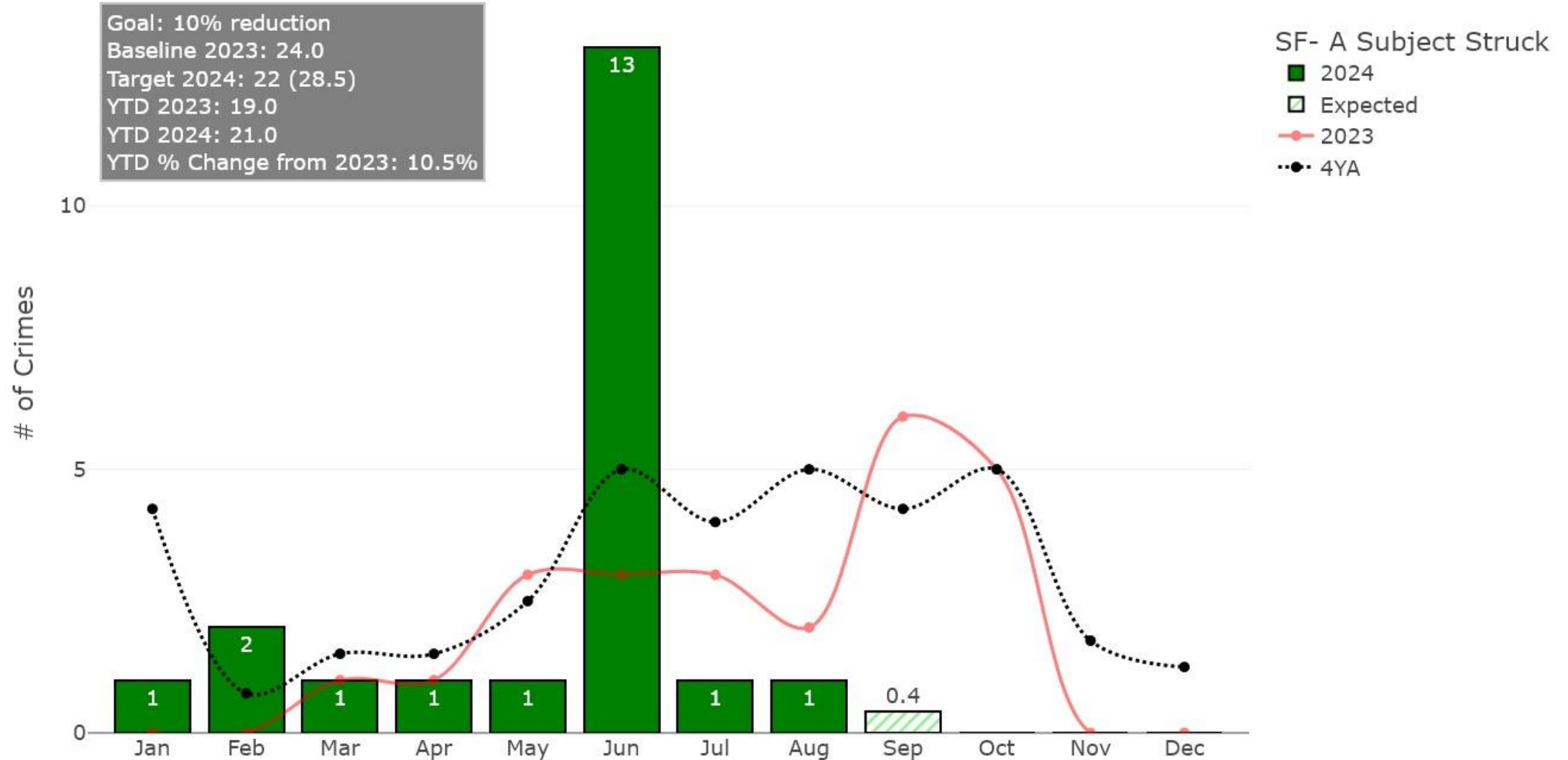
# Crime Reduction Goals: Homicide





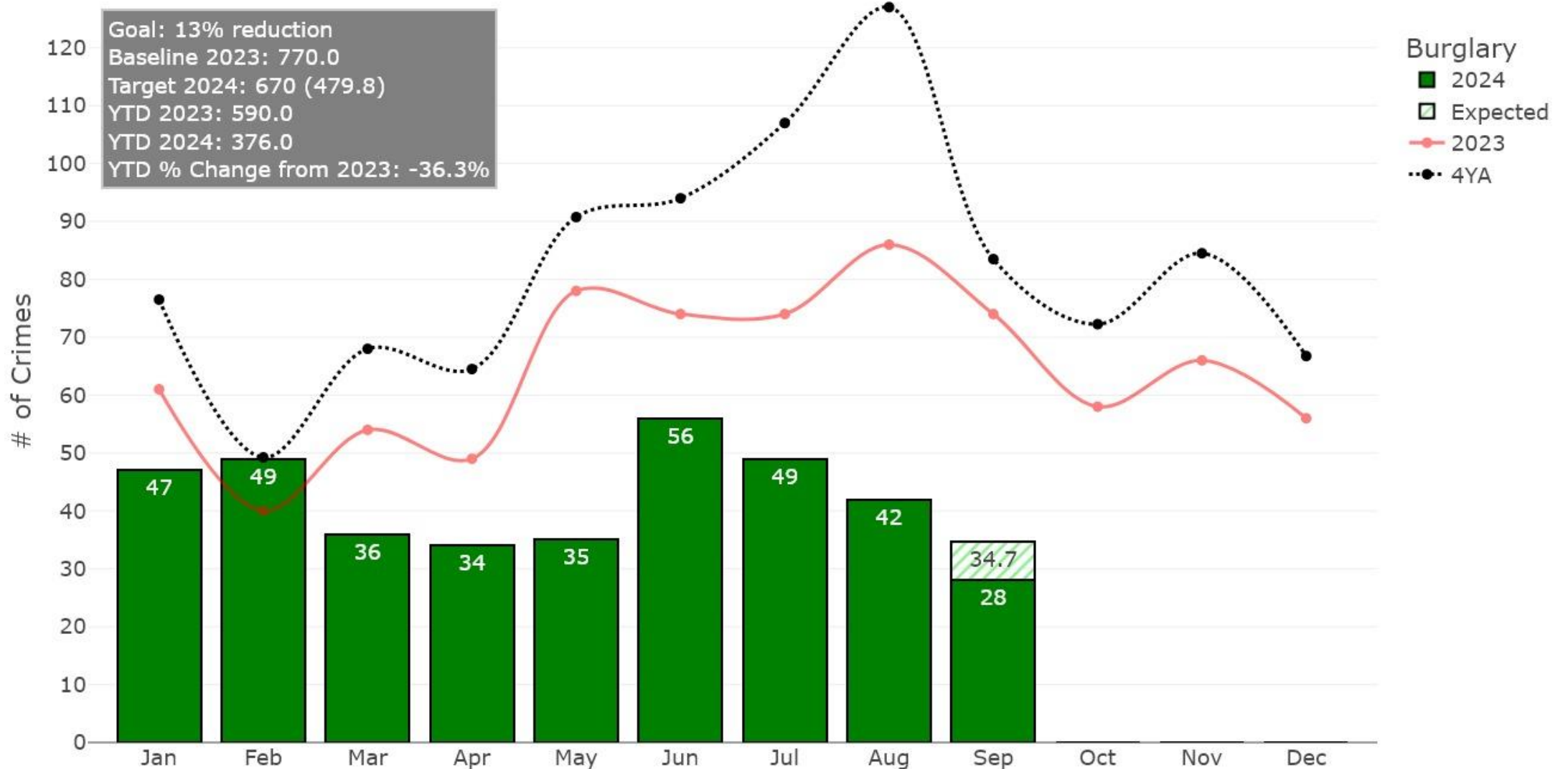


# Crime Reduction Goals: SF - Subject Struck



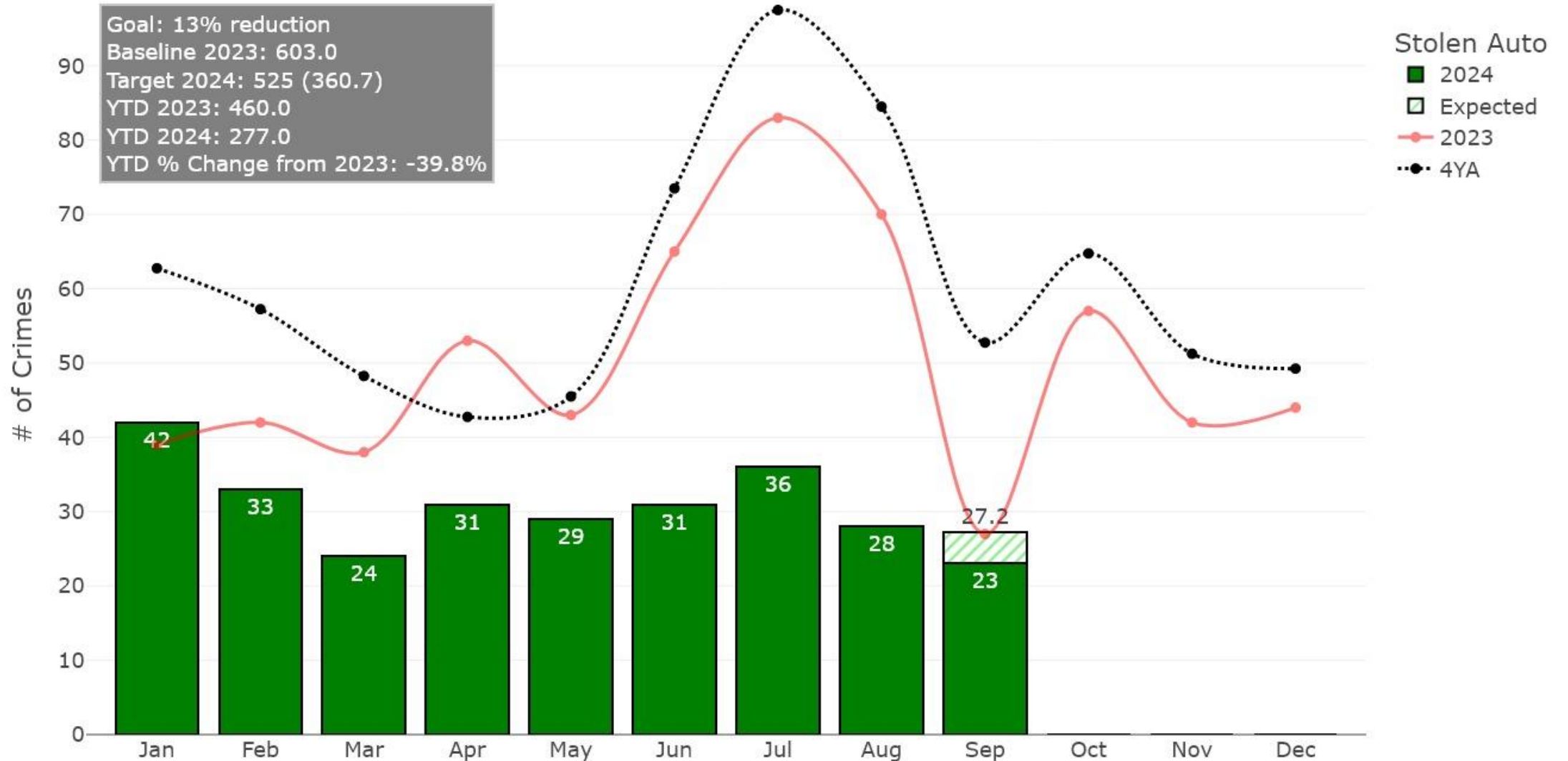


# Crime Reduction Goals: Burglary

# Shots Fired Report

## 2024 Shots Fired

### 2023 YTD Totals/2024 YTD Totals

City-wide: **118/95 Total**

Property damage: 33/32 Incidents

- Occupied Dwellings Struck: 16/12 Incidents

Subjects struck by gunfire: 19/22 Subjects

- Includes direct / indirect

- Does not include accidental discharge/self inflicted

Accidental discharge: 5/2 Incidents

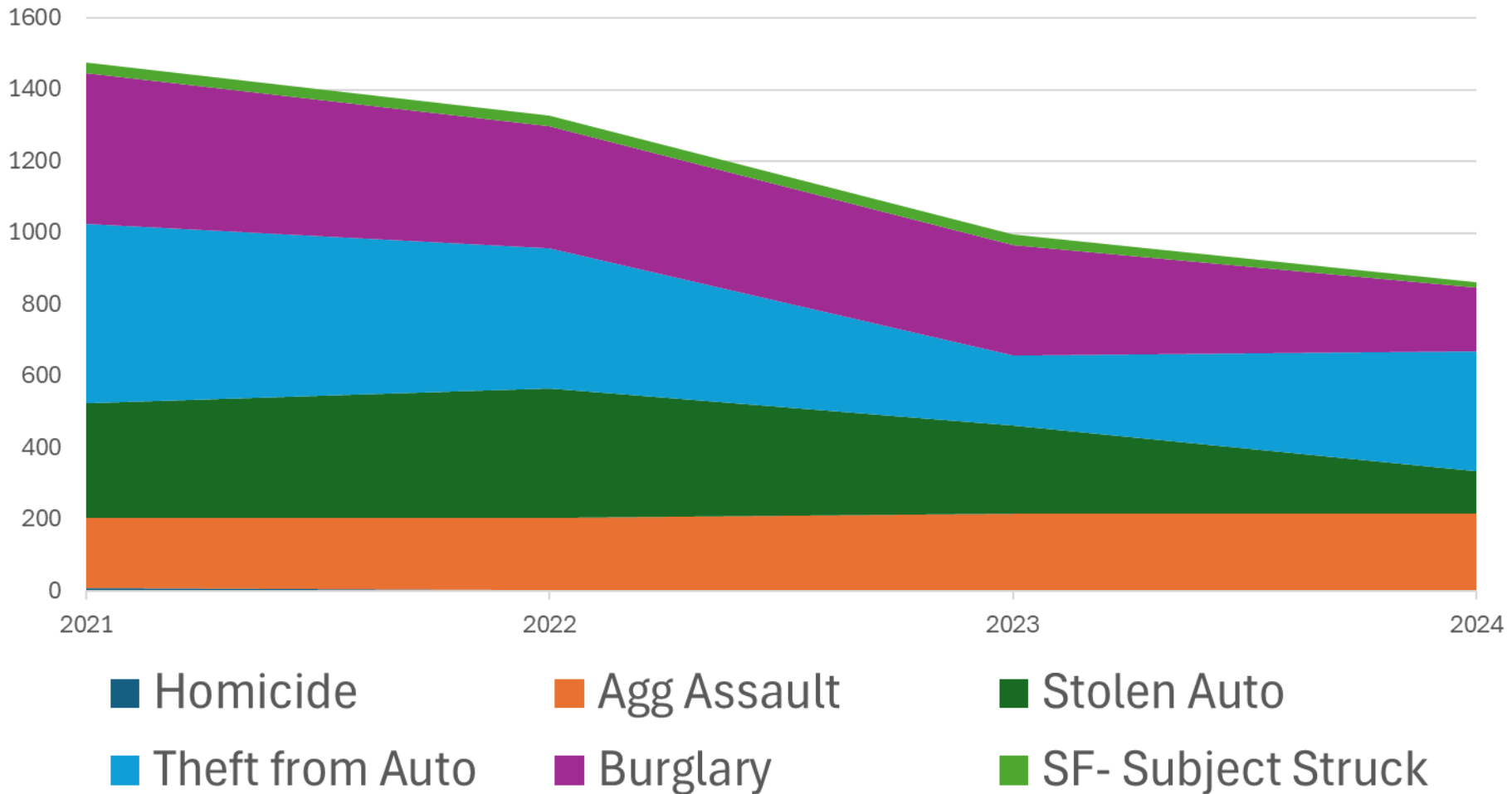
Self Inflicted (Intentional): 6/10 Incidents

Shell Casings Recovered: 323/247

The 95 shots fired incidents reported (1/1–9/30/2024) have resulted in a 19% *decrease* from 2023 YTD (118 through 9/30/2023).
