SUBJECT: 2013 1st Quarter Traffic Enforcement Activity Report

The information provided in this document represents the Madison Police Department's traffic enforcement activity for January - March, 2013.

Traffic Citations

The Madison Police Department issued **6,990** traffic citations (**4,190** citations were for hazardous violations and **2,800** citations were for non-hazardous violations), in the 1st quarter of 2013. These numbers were higher than the total number of citations (**6,751**) issued in the 1st quarter of 2012 and significantly higher than the **4,855** citations that the Madison Police Department issued for the 1st quarter of 2011.

Of the **6,990** total citations issued, **2,751** citations (**1,572** hazardous and (**1,179**) non-hazardous) were issued by the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team. These numbers represent an increase in the total number of citations issued by TEST officers as compared to the 1st quarters of 2012 (**2,655**) and 2011 (**1,495**).

Speeding

During the 1st quarter of 2013 citations for speeding issued department wide totaled (2,468). This is consistent with the 2,500 citations issued in the 1st quarter of 2012, and significantly higher than the 1,266 issued in the first quarter of 2011.

Hazardous Violations

Department wide **4,190** hazardous citations were issued during 1st quarter 2013. This is a slight decrease from the **4,218** citations issued during 1st quarter 2012.

Non-Hazardous Violations

There were **2,800** citations issued for non-hazardous offenses 1st quarter 2013. This compares with **2,533** citations during 1st quarter 2012.

Traffic Complaint Hotline

The Traffic Complaint Hotline (previously known as the Speeders Hotline) received **200** citizen calls during the first quarter of 2013. **106** warning letters were sent as a result of reported violations.

School Zones

School zones violation reports from Crossing Guards resulted in 36 warning letters and 40 citations being issued in the 1st quarter of 2013.

Traffic Enforcement/Safety Grants

56 traffic enforcement overtime grant initiatives were scheduled for the 1st quarter of 2013. These were coordinated through the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety. The grant initiatives focused on impaired driver (OMVWI), excessive speed, and seat belt enforcement. In addition, the Madison Police Department participated in a multijurisdictional grant sponsored by the State of Wisconsin and administered by the Dane County Sheriff's Department which focused on enforcement of traffic violations in and along the beltline corridor. These grant initiatives resulted in **1,338** citations, compared to **37** grants and **875** citations during the 1st quarter 2012.

Significant Crashes

In the 1st quarter 2013, Traffic Specialists investigated 2 significant traffic crashes. These crashes resulted in 2 deaths. One crash is still being investigated as a hit & run. The 2nd crash involved the death of a 2 year old female and resulted in no criminal charges being issued.

During 2013 the officers and supervisors of Madison Police Department will continue to be cognizant of the vital role that traffic enforcement plays in the safety of the Madison community and will continue to be committed to make traffic safety and enforcement a priority in 2013.

T.E.S.T

The T.E.S.T has been involved in numerous media interviews and campaigns relating to traffic safety this includes outreach to the Latino community through radio talk show appearances at La Movida, 1480 AM radio station. In addition to daily Traffic enforcement projects throughout the city the T.E.S.T. also focuses daily on school zone enforcement. The T.E.S.T also received a new laser unit from funds from collaboration with the Dane County Sheriff's Office SMART grant.
