The Plan Commission recommended approval subject to the comments and conditions contained within the Plan Commission materials and the following revised and additional conditions:

- That final plans shall include a barrier preventing access from the courtyard area to the rooftop of the adjacent restaurant at 425 North Frances Street (Porta Bella Restaurant).
- That condition 44 be revised as noted in the July 22 memorandum of the Zoning Administrator to read "As submitted, the proposed bike parking solution appears to address the bike parking needs for the development. This cannot be confirmed until the building is built and fully occupied. Thus, the bike parking shall be studied by Zoning and Traffic Engineering staff when the development is fully occupied, and if additional bike parking areas are determined necessary, automobile parking spaces shall be substituted with surface, structured, or wall-mount bicycle parking facilities."
- That condition 32 of the July 10 staff report be revised to remove the requirement for the applicant to provide an additional exit-only driveway access from the parking facility onto Frances Street.

Mark Woulf, City Alcohol and Food Policy Coordinator, said two years ago the ALRC and the Council were asked to look at alcohol licensing and the Alcohol License District Ordinance (ALDO). A seventeen (17) page staff report was created with twenty-five (25) recommendations related to alcohol establishments and business development.

Mr. Clarke asked what the EDC is being asked to recommend with this motion.

Mr. Woulf said the ordinance and the policy changes move along different timelines through the approval process. This approach allows further exploration and time to bring ideas back to the applicable committees.

Mr. Mikolajewski said there are two parts to this:

- 1. The alcohol license changes
- 2. The promotion of businesses which includes:
  - Expanding the Facade Improvement Grant program to fund interior building changes to businesses that do not serve alcohol.
  - Way finding changes into and through the Downtown
  - o Promoting alternatives to alcohol establishments, such as music venues
  - Adds the possibility of the City becoming a sponsor for retail events
  - Emphasizes the importance of Downtown parking for visitors, employees
  - Suggest improvements to the development process.

Ms. Torkildson asked if adding one position to enforce alcohol licenses is enough.

Mr. Woulf said the key to this is getting the Alcohol License Review Committee involved early in the process. An extra staff person or extra staff time would move toward a clear vision of license conditions. More staff education may be needed.

Mr. Clarke said the data on police activity and the business mix has been static over the last twenty years. What data says these regulations need to cover the entire city?

Mr. Woulf said the citywide piece is being able to take a look at an application when it is submitted to see if it fits into that area.

Mr. Mikolajewski said the proposed citywide system has positive entrepreneurial benefits that allow the applicant to specify their particular concept that may not fit into the categories as they exist today. An example of this is a coffee shop that wishes to serve wine. Today that has to be considered either a tavern or a

restaurant.

Following the presentation, the Plan Commission recommended approval of the Madison Cultural Plan by voice vote/ other. Members of the Commission offered the following comments on the plan:

#### Hamilton-Nisbet:

- Members of the business community should be added to the Arts Commission;
- Metrics should be developed to measure/ gauge success;
- Define how the plan gets implemented procedurally;
- Clarify who will be responsible for the annual review of the Overture Center?

#### Olson:

- Did the steering committee or consultant consider other models for arts infrastructure? Georgene Pomplun responded that the plan was more a vision plan. The consultant discussed initiatives from other cities, in particular Charlotte, NC, Austin, TX, and Atlanta,  $G\Delta$ 

#### Fey:

- Regional focus and cooperation is important; broadens focus of what the City can do;
- Good to question the structure of a board or commission through planning process;
- How to think about the lakes is important.

#### Andrzejewski:

- Liked the scope of the plan and the many dimensions of "culture";
- Public-private partnerships are essential;
- Regional emphasis is good;
- Need more information on plan implementation in the final document.

### Ald. Rummel:

- Thanked the steering committee for their work;
- Plan needs to identify short- and long-term projects;
- Can the Overture Center build our capacity for arts?
- References to "Winnebago" should probably be changed to "HoChunk";
- Plan creates a framework that may or may not come into being;
- Surprised so much of the focus is on what the City should do;
- Questioned the review of festivals in the plan.

Karin Wolf, the City Arts Administrator, introduced the Madison Cultural Plan.

Steve Goldberg, 4914 Whitcomb Drive, representing the Cultural Plan Steering Committee and appearing in support. Mr. Goldberg explained that the cultural plan represents an 18 month comprehensive research project that was as inclusive as possible and included numerous interest groups, citizens, companies and artists. Overwhelmingly, these groups noted that there is no utility that links all creative/cultural sectors. He explained that there is a strong desire to align resources with cultural assets. He believes the cultural plan is broad reaching with detailed recommendations and that it will provide the connective tissue to bring the creative/cultural sectors together.

Jason Tish, 2714 LaFollette Avenue, representing Cultural Plan Steering Committee and appearing in support and available to answer questions. Mr. Tish explained this plan defines culture to include history and historic architecture. Other City plans were reviewed when preparing Madison's Cultural Plan. Flint, MI and Vancouver, WA plans were used as examples of plans that seemed successful incorporating history. Madison's cultural plan incorporates historic preservation and cultural resources very well.

Ms. Slattery asked about recommendation #28 and what is meant by "incentives". It was noted that the State has laws that no adjustments be made in Real Estate Taxes. Local incentives could include building materials rebate, City façade grant extension program, etc.

Ms. Gehrig asked about page 35, historic preservation, questioning what is meant in the last sentence. Also in sentence before that "the State's Historical Society" should be "Wisconsin Historical Society". Ms. Gehrig also noted that the cultural plan is interesting and well written.

Ms. Gehrig also suggested changing the language in recommendation #22 where it states "make the process for designation and review more efficient and predictable" to "make all aspects of the administrative process more efficient and predictable". Ms. Wolf stated that the language may be revised. Mr. Tish said that this plan is an opportunity to redefine the words landmark and culture and blend them successfully.

Ms. Slattery asked about #20. Perhaps the wording should be changed from: unless otherwise prohibited by other agency standards "where possible" to "where appropriate".

Gehrig asked what is meant by "worthy" in #28? She suggested removing the word. Levitan said that wording should be changed to mean that develop incentives to encourage property owners to seek landmark designation. Change the wording to read "incentives for the preservation of locally designated landmarks and sites."

Levitan also suggested that the word "affirmative" be removed from #28.
