Parent Involvement and Support

- Parent involvement and support is identified as a primary focus area of program.
 Impacts of this focus include:
 - o Bridging gap between school and community
 - Increased parental involvement in school and their child's development
 - Accessible source of support for parents in need of a variety of services
- 100% of participants receive free or reduced lunch through MMSD, thus fees are not charged for program. Instead, parental support is obtained though the following methods and opportunities:
 - Weekly to daily communication between program staff and parents.
 - Parents volunteer as reading buddies, tutors, activity leaders within the Children's Program and give back through volunteering in other capacities at the center including one parent's role as a current board member.
 - Opportunities to participate in events and workshops with their child or related to their child's academic success and development. Examples include parent/child participation in Edgewood College's Rose Project and family nights at the center, and workshops that enhance parent capacities related to their child's academic success including Infinite Campus information sessions.
 - Parents are invited and transported to school events by program staff.
 - Parents are chaperones on field trips, especially during the summer months.
 - Program staff focus on the holistic well-being of each child. Through this perspective, parents utilize program staff as resources to enhance their own capacities. Example include staff providing GED tutoring to parents, assisting with interpreting, facilitating communication with Glendale School, and connecting parents with needed services.
