

## Madison GUEP Overview

### Goals:

- 1) submit GUEP application – excellent and on-time
- 2) lay groundwork for stakeholder participation in development of GUEP plan

### Elements of the work:

- 1) Prepare an LOI and accompanying materials, including a community profile, as soon as possible - DONE
- 2) Contact key stakeholders working on energy efficiency in the Madison area, including:
  - a. MGE
  - b. MMSD
  - c. UW
  - d. Sustain Dane
  - e. Focus on Energy
  - f. Project Home
  - g. Enact/MEG
  - h. Cool Choices
  - i. Other eligible local governments
- 3) Map current energy efficiency efforts, their scope and progress
- 4) Identify gaps in current efforts and opportunities for action
- 5) Identify projects that respond to the priorities of the competition, including low-income housing improvements, whole-house retrofits, and working with K-12 students
- 6) Prepare, in collaboration with City staff and other stakeholders, the City's application
  - a. Legal and demographic description of the community;
  - b. Brief biographies of key community and municipal leaders of the GUEP prize effort.
  - c. Letters of commitment (standard form, provided by GUEP) from all community-serving utilities, affirming that accurate, aggregate consumption data will be made available on a monthly basis to the prize administrators in the required format.
  - d. Description, history, and status of all existing community energy-savings programs, if any (including relevant staff and budgets);
  - e. Highlights of the energy-savings program that would be implemented to compete for the prize;
