

8.19 ANIMALS PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS.

(1) Dogs Prohibited in Parks and on School Grounds.

(a) Prohibition. Except as provided for under Subdivision (b), no owner, keeper or handler of a dog shall allow, cause or permit such dog to enter or remain in either:

1. Any public park in the City of Madison; or,
2. Any school grounds in the City of Madison as have been designated by order of the Board of Education as areas in which dogs are prohibited.

(b) Exceptions. The prohibition in Subdivision (a) shall not apply to the following:

1. Service Dogs. Dogs specially trained, or dogs being specially trained, to lead visually- or hearing-impaired persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons when leading or accompanying a visually impaired, hearing-impaired or mobility impaired person.
2. Law Enforcement Dogs. Dogs used by or under the auspices of the City of Madison Police Department or other law enforcement department in the course of official police business.
3. On-Leash Dog Parks.
 - a. On-Leash Dog Park Locations. Subject to the conditions set forth in sub. b, dogs are permitted to be in posted areas of the following parks or any other area so designated by the Board of Park Commissioners and confirmed by the Common Council:

b. Conditions of On-Leash Dog Park Use. All users of the designated on-leash dog parks set forth in sub. a. must comply with the following conditions:

- i. The dog must be restrained by a chain, rope, cord or leash of sufficient strength to control the action of such dog. The length of the chain, rope, cord or leash shall not exceed six (6) feet when the owner or keeper and the dog are proceeding along any pedestrian or transportation corridor.
- ii. The dog is licensed and must wear a rabies vaccination tag as required by Sec. 23.39(3), owner identification as required by Sec. 23.33(6)(a), a license tag as required by Sec. 23.33(6)(c), and a permit tag as required in sub. iv. below.
- iii. Dog feces shall be removed and disposed of in compliance with Sec. 7.322.
- iv. The owner of the dog must have secured a permit for use of dog exercise areas in city and county parks.

4. Off-Leash Dog Parks. Dogs are permitted to run at large, off-leash, in certain parks, as set forth in Sec. 23.32.

(c) The Board of Park Commissioners shall cause signs to be posted in parks or park areas where dogs are permitted and the School Board shall do likewise in school grounds or school ground areas wherein dogs are prohibited.

(2) Horses Prohibited in Certain Areas. No owner or keeper of a horse, except horses used by the City of Madison Police Department in the course of official police business, shall suffer, cause or permit such horse to enter or remain in any public park in the City of Madison unless so designated by the Superintendent of Parks.

(3) Certain Animals Prohibited on Zoo Property. No owner or keeper of any animal shall suffer, cause or permit said animal to enter or remain on Henry Vilas Zoo property unless specific permission has been granted by the Henry Vilas Zoo Director. (Cr. by ORD-11-00168, 12-6-11)

(4) Any person violating any provision of this section for the first time in any twelve-month period may be subject to a forfeiture of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100); any person violating any provision of this section for the second time in any twelve-month period may be subject to a forfeiture of not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200); any person violating any provision of this section for the third time in any twelve-month period may be subject to a forfeiture of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300); any person violating any provision of this section for the fourth and subsequent time in any twelve-month period may be subject to a forfeiture of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500).

8.20 FISHING IN LAKE MONONA AT SOUTH LIVINGSTON STREET PROHIBITED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to fish in Lake Monona from the street end at South Livingston Street. Any person violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50) for each offense.
