Staff stated that this is a straightforward project, but it must be reviewed by the Landmarks Commission and the Historical Society. Hoffman expressed the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Association's excitement for this project and the upcoming Century Celebration of Tenney Park.

Prime asked if the group could continue working on the project if they haven't received approval from the Historical Society yet, and staff confirmed they could continue working. Hoffman asked about the timeframe of the Historical Society's review, and staff stated that by statute, they have 30 days to complete the review.

Rummel asked how they found the historic postcards. Hoffman stated that they were provided by various postcard collectors in Madison, and they tried to select five postcards that each told different stories about Tenney Park.
