Dear Mr. Marty;

The one-lot Certified Survey Map for property located at 134 S. Fair Oaks Avenue, Section 5, Township 7N, Range 10E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The subject property is zoned TE (Traditional Employment District). The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied prior to final approval and recording of the CSM are:

1. Development on this site will require a larger diameter City sewer main be installed across S. Fair Oaks Ave.
2. All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) charges are due and payable prior to Engineering sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's / Subdivision Contract. Contact Mark Moder (608-261-9250) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff.
3. The Developer shall construct public sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and drainage improvements as necessary to serve the lots within the plat/csm. (MGO 16.23(9)(d))
4. Prior to approval, the owner or owner's representative shall obtain a permit to plug each existing sanitary sewer lateral that serves a building which is proposed for demolition. For each lateral to be plugged the owner shall complete a sewer lateral plugging application and pay the applicable permit fees. The permit application is available on line at <http://www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/permits.cfm> . (MGO CH 35.02(14))

5. An erosion control plan and permit shall be submitted to the Engineering Division for review and approval prior to grading or any other construction activities. The Preconstruction Meeting for Public Improvements shall not be scheduled prior to issuance of this permit. The applicant shall demonstrate compliance with Section 37.07 and 37.08 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding permissible soil loss rates. The erosion control plan shall include Universal Soil Loss Equation (USLE) computations for the construction period. Measures shall be implemented in order to maintain a soil loss rate below 5-tons per acre per year.
6. A portion of this project comes under the jurisdiction of the US Army Corp of Engineers and WDNR for wetland or wetland indicator soils issues. A permit for those matters shall be required prior to construction on any of the lots currently within the jurisdictional flood plain. (NOTIFICATION)
7. This site appears to disturb over one (1) acre of land and requires a permit from the WDNR for stormwater management and erosion control. The City of Madison has been required by the WDNR to review projects for compliance with NR216 and NR-151 however a separate permit submittal is still required to the WDNR for this work. The City of Madison cannot issue our permit until concurrence is obtained from the WDNR via their NOI or WRAPP permit process. Contact Eric Rortvedt at 273-5612 of the WDNR to discuss this requirement. 8. A minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff on the plat/csm the applicant shall contact either Tim Troester at 261-1995 ([ttroester@cityofmadison.com](mailto:ttroester@cityofmadison.com)) or Brenda Stanley at 608-261-9127 ([bstanley@cityofmadison.com](mailto:bstanley@cityofmadison.com)) to obtain the final stormwater utility charges that are due and payable prior to sub-division of the properties. The stormwater utility charges (as all utility charges) are due for the previous months of service. All charges shall be cleared prior to the land division (and subsequent obsolesces of the existing parcel). (POLICY)
9. The following note shall be added to the certified survey map. "All lots created by this certified survey map are individually responsible for compliance with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances in regard to storm water management at the time they develop."
10. Based on the Phase 2 ESA Report, the property may contain residual contaminated soil. If contaminated soil is encountered as part of this redevelopment, all WDNR and DSPS regulations must be followed for proper handling and disposal.
11. The construction of this project will require that the applicant shall enter into a City / Developer agreement for the required infrastructure improvements. The applicant shall contact City Engineering to schedule the development of the plans and the agreement. The City Engineer will not sign off on this project without the agreement executed by the developer. Obtaining a developer's agreement generally takes approximately 4-6 weeks, minimum. (MGO 16.23(9)c)
12. The Applicant shall Construct Sidewalk to a plan approved by the City

13. Change the label for the Sidewalk Easement to match the title of the easement text on sheet 4.
14. The Applicant shall submit to Jeff Quamme, prior to Engineering sign-off of the subject plat, one (1) digital CADD drawing and one (1) signed copy of the final plat/CSM to the Mapping/GIS Section of the Engineering Division either as hard copy or Adobe pdf format. The digital CADD file shall be submitted in the WISDOT County Coordinate System, Dane County Zone datum in either Auto CAD Version compatible with MicroStation Version V8i, MicroStation Version V8i or older or Universal DXF Formats. The digital CADD file(s) shall contain the minimum of the items stated below, each on a separate layer name/level number. All line work shall be void of gaps and overlaps that would cause any parcel, street or easement to not properly close. All line work orientation and geometrics shall match the dimensioning as labeled on the final recorded plat:
  - a. Right-of-Way lines (public and private)
  - b. Lot lines
  - c. Lot numbers
  - d. Lot/Plat dimensions
  - e. Street names
  - f. Easement lines (i.e. street, sanitary, storm (including wetland & floodplain boundaries) water, pedestrian/bike/walkway, or any public and/or private interest easement except local service for Cable TV, gas, electric and fiber optics).

NOTE: This Transmittal is a separate requirement from the required Engineering Streets Section for design purposes. The Developer/Surveyor shall submit new updated final plat, electronic data and a written notification to Engineering Mapping for any changes to the plat which occur subsequent to any original submittal of data and prior to final sign off.

15. Prior to Engineering final sign-off by main office for Plats or Certified Survey Maps (CSM), the final CSM must be submitted to Engineering Division Surveyor / Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division sign-off. Electronic mail submittal of the FINAL Plat or CSM in PDF form is preferred. 16. This pending Certified Survey Map application shall be completed and recorded with the Dane County Register of Deeds (ROD) prior to issuance of any building permits for new construction. When the recorded CSM image is available from the ROD, the Assessor's Office can then create the new Address-Parcel-Owner (APO) data in GEO so that the Accela system can upload this data and permit issuance made available for this new land record.
17. If any portion of this CSM lies within the 100-year flood plain, it shall be shown on the Certified Survey map.

18. Park Impact Fees (comprised of the Park Infrastructure Impact Fee, per MGO Sec. 20.08(2)), and Park-Land Impact Fees, per MGO Sec. 16.23(8)(f) and 20.08(2) will be required for all new residential development associated with this project. This development is within the East Park-Infrastructure Impact Fee district. Please reference ID# 16161 when contacting Parks about this project.
19. Pursuant to the authority established under Wis. Stat. § 66.0617(7), and in the interests of promoting the development of low-cost housing in the City, low-cost housing is exempt from the park impact fees beginning January 1, 2017. This exemption only applies to those dwelling units or bedrooms within a development that are determined to be low-cost housing. This exemption does not extend to the land dedication requirements set forth under Sec. 16.23(8)(f), MGO, nor any other impact fees that may apply to a development.
20. The park impact fee will be exempt for developments that meet the “low-cost housing” requirements, as defined as rental or owner-occupied housing units that are affordable, as that term is defined in Sec. 4.22(2), MGO, and which meet the deed restriction requirements of Sec. 4.22(7). The determination whether a proposed development will create low-cost housing, and how much low-cost housing it will create, shall be made by the Community Development Division.
21. The following note should be included on the subdivision: “LOTS WITHIN THIS SUBDIVISION ARE SUBJECT TO IMPACT FEES THAT ARE DUE AND PAYABLE AT THE TIME BUILDING PERMIT(S) ARE ISSUED.”
22. Parks Division will be required to sign off on this subdivision.

23. CERTIFICATE AND CONSENT REQUIREMENTS -- A Consent of Lessee shall be included for all tenant interests in excess of one year, recorded or unrecorded, and executed prior to CSM sign-off.
24. REAL ESTATE TAXES AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS -- 2017 real estate taxes are outstanding for the subject property.

Per 236.21(3) Wis. Stats. and 16.23(5)(g)(1) Madison General Ordinances, the property owner shall pay all real estate taxes that are accrued or delinquent for the subject property prior to CSM recording. This includes property tax bills for the prior year that are distributed at the beginning of the year. Receipts from the City of Madison Treasurer are to be provided before or at the time of sign-off. Payment is made to:

As of the date of this letter there are no special assessments reported. If special assessments are levied against the property prior to signoff, they shall be paid in full pursuant to MGO Section 16.23(5)(g)1.

25. TITLE REPORT UPDATE -- Pursuant to Madison City Ordinance Section 16.23(5)(g)(4), the owner shall furnish an updated title report to Heidi Radlinger in City's Office of Real Estate Services ([hradlinger@cityofmadison.com](mailto:hradlinger@cityofmadison.com)), as well as the survey firm preparing the proposed CSM. The report shall search the period subsequent to the date of the initial title report (8/16/16) submitted with the CSM application and include all associated documents that have been recorded since the initial title report. Surveyor shall update the CSM with the most recent information reported in the title update.
26. COPY OF RECORDED CSM -- The owner shall email the document number of the recorded CSM to Heidi Radlinger as soon as the recording information is available.

**Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.**

**A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division will be reviewed by the Common Council on August 7, 2018.**

As soon as the comments and conditions have been satisfied as verified with a completed affidavit form (attached), the original along with the revised Certified Survey Map, with all signatures and approvals from the reviewing agencies, shall be brought to this office for final signoff. You or your client may then record the certified survey at the Dane County Register of Deeds. For information on recording procedures and fees, contact the Register of Deeds at (608) 266-4141.

Prior to City Engineering final sign-off by the main office of the CSM, the final CSM shall be submitted to the Engineering Division Surveyor/ Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division signoff. E-mail submittal of the final CSM in PDF form is preferred. Transmit to [jqumme@cityofmadison.com](mailto:jrqumme@cityofmadison.com).

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. **The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in twelve (12) months from the date of the approving resolution or this letter, whichever is later.**
