


USA Cycling Capitol Square Criterium

Emergency Action Plan

<u>Brief description</u>: The USA Cycling National Championship Capitol Square Criterium is planned for Sunday July 6, 2014. It is day 5 out of five days of bike races that are part of the USA Cycling National elite road championships July 2-6, 2014. The Capitol Square event will consist of multiple competitive bike races (see Race Schedule below) on a closed circuit course around the Wisconsin State Capitol. The Start/Finish and area will be near Starbucks on East Main St (map enclosed). An estimated 800 bicycle racers and 1000 spectators are expected to attend thoroughout the course of the day.

Emergency Action Plan

An emergency situation may arise during the Capitol Square Criterium and this is an outline of responses for those situations. Race-assigned radios and cell phones will be the primary form of communication between race staff, medical staff, and community officials (Police and Fire departments will be present, their number and locations at the discretion of the Police and Fire Chiefs)

Emergency Action Plan Personnel

Course Marshalls (volunteers) provided by Great Dane Velo Cycling club

Official Race Staff (including Team Sports Race Staff and USA Cyling race officials)

First Aid/EMT coverage to be provided by UW Health and the Midwest Mountain Bike Patrol.

Madison Fire Department Ambulance (TBD)

Madison Fire and Capitol Police

Roles of the Emergency Staff Personnel

<u>Course Marshalls</u>: Alert Chief Referee and medical staff of an injury/accident via the phone/radio and determine the appropriate action with respect to ongoing race status. Course Marshalls will be assigned to intersections and course crossings for crowd control and safety during the Capitol Square Criterium (see diagram on last page for course marshall stations).

Team Sports Race Staff: Help direct crowd control in the event of a significant emergency situation.

<u>First Aid staff</u>: Assess injury or illness and treat the minor scrapes and bruises that go along with bike racing (providing first aid, wound care, etc.), as well as evaluation/handling of any major injuries that might occur and determine if more medical care is needed which may include activating the 911 system and/or calling for an ambulance for emergency medical transport.

<u>Madison Fire Department Ambulance</u>: Standby either at a central location or at the Fire Stations per Shift Commander. [private ambulance provider under consideration]

<u>Fire and Police Officers</u>: Capitol Police will be positioned per Shift Commander. In the event of any major emergency situations the National Incident Command System will be implimented.

Basic guidelines for Emergency Team:

Immediate care of athlete: Most qualified individual on the scene should provide direct acute care.

- Life threatening: The first responders povide immediate care i.e. CPR, spinal stabilization, control severe bleeding, etc, and makes the call for an ambulance.
- Orthopedic: The first responders assess severity of injury and appropriate transport method i.e ambulance, ATV cart to medical tent, athlete able to ride/walk, etc.
- General medical: Transport to UW Health medical tent located near the corner of MLK and East Main St.

<u>EMS Activation</u>: This should be done as soon as the situation is deemed life threathening in any emergency situation. Either medical staff person or a Race official should make the call to EMS.

The person calling should remain calm and have the following information:

- Callers name, phone number and exact location
- Severity of injuries, number of people involved.
- What care is being provided
- Instructions to reach the scene

The communication to EMS will be made by race radio or cellular phone. Once the call is made either a medical staff person or a Race staff person shall meet the emergency medical at the designated location. Note: in no circumstances should EMS personnel or ambulance enter onto the racecourse without the Chief Referee's consent! This is to avoid injury to other race participants.

Emergency Communication Equipment:

The main form of communication will be race assigned radios and cellular phones. They will be checked

for level of reception/signal on the day of the race by medical staff touring the course.

Emergency Equipment: Emergency medical supplies such as splints, slings, irrigation and bandages will

be kept in the vehicle used by medical staff to go to the scene of the emergency. A designated car

(licenced vehicle) or ATV cart will be used.

Spectators, Media, Family Members: Event staff will maintain spectators at a distance to allow medical

staff to provide care and give emergency personell access to the location. Team Sports

information/marketing personel will direct media to an appropiate site until a statement is available.

Event officials (and local Police, if needed) will escort family members to a private area until medical

staff is able to communicate the plan of care and give information about the incident.

Overall: The importance of being properly prepared cannot be stressed enough to insure the best

possible care for a rider in the event of an emergency. Copies of the racecourse map with numbered

turns, locations of the First Aid tent, emergency personell, etc. will be distributed to all Course Marshalls

and Official Race Staff prior to the event.

Severe Weather Policy

Lightning/Tornado:

The Official Race Staff (ie, USA Cycling race officials and Team Sports event staff), in consultation with

the Fire and Police Officers, will monitor weather conditions and weather alerts that may arise primarily

through the use of smart phone technology. The Official Race Staff will keep the Course Marshalls

informed of the weather conditions and alerts. The Official Race Staff, in consultation with the Fire

and/or Police department, will make the determination as to the race being delayed, postponed, etc.

In the event of a weather interruption, the Official Race Staff will work with the race announcers and

Course Marshals to direct riders and spectators to available shelter and pre-designated emergency

evacuation locations.

The nearest hospital is Meriter Hospital, 202 S Park St, Madison 53715, 608 417 6000. The Emergency Room is 1.2 Miles South of the event.

The nearest Level 1 Trauma Center is UW Hospital, 600 Highland Ave, Madison 53792, 608 263 6400, 1.6 Miles to the Southwest of the event.

Emergency Evacuation Locations: The Madison State Capitol is a designated Tornado Shelter and is located adjacent to the racecourse.
