For the second year in a row, there has been a drop in enrollment which would have been worse except for a significant increase in low income families using the state Wisconsin Shares child care subsidy system. The hardest sector hit is again family child care where the decline was larger than the total drop in the number of children in care, as families chose to use group centers instead of family child care.

The pattern reflects the beginning of the recession which stuck harder in the 4th quarter of 2008. Anecdotal information suggests that there will be further enrollment drops identified when the March 2009 survey is done.

Between March 2007 and March 2008 twelve full day group centers closed, 8% of all the full day centers in Dane County. 60% were <u>outside</u> the City of Madison. An analysis of their March 2007 enrollment data shows 10 of the 12 had 25% or more of their children whose care was paid for by Wisconsin Shares subsidies. A third had 50% or more children on subsidies. All were for profit programs. This is significant as non-profit centers have been reporting needing to do increased fundraising to cover losses related to the subsidy program, which has had its maximum reimbursement rates frozen for the past 4 years in Dane County.

The enrollment data indicates that the market may become more dependent on Wisconsin Shares as the recession continues. With a correlation between high levels of shares subsidy use by parents and centers closing, there could be potential problems related to early childhood education in the coming months and the potential for the loss of child care and early childhood education programs. While these services will be in less demand during a recession, they will be a critical component in any future economic recovery. As such to stabilize the child care market during the recession, it is critical that funding be found to insure that actual market rates can be paid for care for children in the subsidy system. The child care market can not afford to absorb losses from the child care subsidies during times of declining enrollment.

The below chart compares regulated capacity for full day centers and after school programs (excluding camps), as reported on the 2007 and 2008 state maximum rates report. The family child care figures are taken from the 2007 and 2008 4-C family child care survey since the state rate survey excludes certified and provisional care. All of the losses in family child are in certified and provisional care. The 12 centers that closed accounted for about 500 slots so the market only made up for part of the loss.

The statistic becomes even more dramatic when analyzed by type of family child care. While only 21% of the children in licensed family child care receive a state subsidy, children on Wisconsin Shares account for 71% of the children in certified family child care and 57% of everyone enrolled in provisional.

Part Day Preschool Rates March 2008

The following are part day preschool rates as reported in March 2008. Since almost all of the programs are non-profit- no analysis was done comparing non-profit and for-profit programs. The pool of programs to analyze is small with many different pricing and other variables. What the below analysis shows is that the most striking difference is between larger and smaller programs. Larger programs cost more due to two factors- 1) these programs offer more scheduling options for parents so that children are often not limited to a few hours of programming 2 or 3 days a week 2) the longer hours for teachers result in more of them qualifying for benefits thus increasing costs.

2008 DANE COUNTY FAMILY CHILD CARE SURVEY REPORT

In March 2008, there were 576 family child care homes in Dane County (a decrease of 28 since 2007). 46% were state licensed. 33% were fully certified and 16% provisionally certified for Dane County by 4-C. 5% were both licensed and certified (included in the licensed totals on the tables). 10% (up 1%) were accredited by the City of Madison through Satellite (on the tables as Madison Accredited). There are also a few small group centers (centers in rented spaces staffed not by the homeowner but by staff hired by outside agencies) that are licensed as family child care homes. Note that since 1996 family childcare has decreased by 190 homes a 25% drop in the number of providers.

80% percent of the licensed family child care homes; 73% of the certified and 80% of the provisionally certified returned surveys. This is the highest return rate in several years. Percentages in brackets after the rates indicate rate of change since 2007. City Accredited homes are those homes inside and outside of Madison accredited by Satellite. The highest weekly rates in the ranges often reflect top rates on sliding fee scales or rates used by providers mainly doing part time care. The first line in each rate category is the number of homes using that rate. Hourly rates are for part time care. There has been a decrease in the number of homes offering daily and hourly part time rates and a higher increase in those rates. 15% of the certified homes and 20% of the provisional only serve children on Wisconsin Shares subsidies and use the maximum payment rate from the state; their data is not included in the rate calculations. 34% (0%) offer discounts for siblings, 3% (-4%) have sliding fee scales. 22% reported serving children evenings and 27% do weekend care. Many categories saw little or no changes this year in their weekly rates suggesting a tight market for child care.
