3. <u>13178</u> Board of Education - Common Council Liaison Committee Update (Scheduling Inservice on Election Days)

Steve Hartley, Chief of Staff for the Superintendent of the Madison Metropolitan School District, distributed the attached list of 28 schools that are used as polling locations, and the attached schedule for the 2009-2010 school year. He reported that the scool calendar is part of a collective bargaining agreement and is established three years in advance. There is some flexibility in scheduling one full inservice day, he said.

The committee requested that the school district keep presidential elections in mind when scheduling inservice days in the future. Malischke suggested listing election days on the school calendar.

15024 Combining Wards into Reporting Units.
