Various Definitions of Homelessness

HUD Definitions of Homelessness

- **Category 1 Literally Homeless** : staying unsheltered or at emergency shelter or transitional housing - tracked in PIT, HUD annual number; eligible for Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing programs
- **Category 2 Imminent Risk of Homelessness**: losing primary residence within 14 days
- **Category 3 Homeless Under Other Federal Statutes**: Unaccompanied youth under 25 years of age, or families with Category 3 children and youth, who do not otherwise qualify as homeless under this definition, but who:
 - **Category 4 Fleeing/Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence**
 - **At Risk of Homelessness**

Doubled Up Homelessness

Doubled-Up is the catchall term that includes households who have lost stable housing and are either self-paying in a hotel/motel or temporarily living in housing that is owned, or rented by another person.

- Present with barriers to securing their own housing such as evictions, income instability, insufficient credit, inadequate rental history, and poor connection to resources to assist with housing navigation among other barriers.

Doubled Up Estimates

No designated system that tracks local, comprehensive Doubled-Up Homelessness

- School Districts
 - Not comprehensive
 - Lacks demographic data
- U.S. Census
 - Data assumptions based on limited population sample
- Homeless Management Information System
 - System not currently structured to track all Doubled-Up households

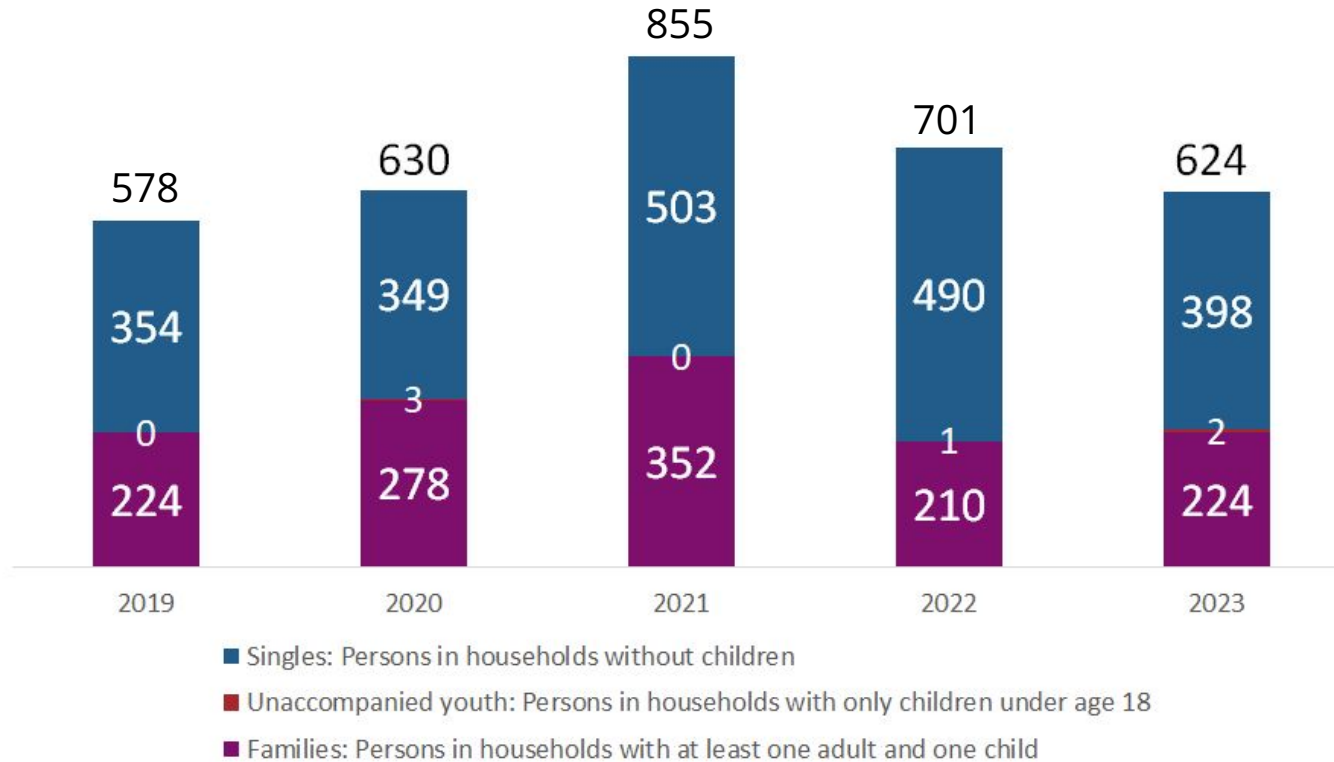
Doubled-Up Data Caveats

- Systems acknowledgement: BIPOC populations are underrepresented in data collection for various reasons
- Variations in age considerations, race categories, and gender identity
- Census data is not necessarily representative of local estimates

January Point in Time 2019- 2023

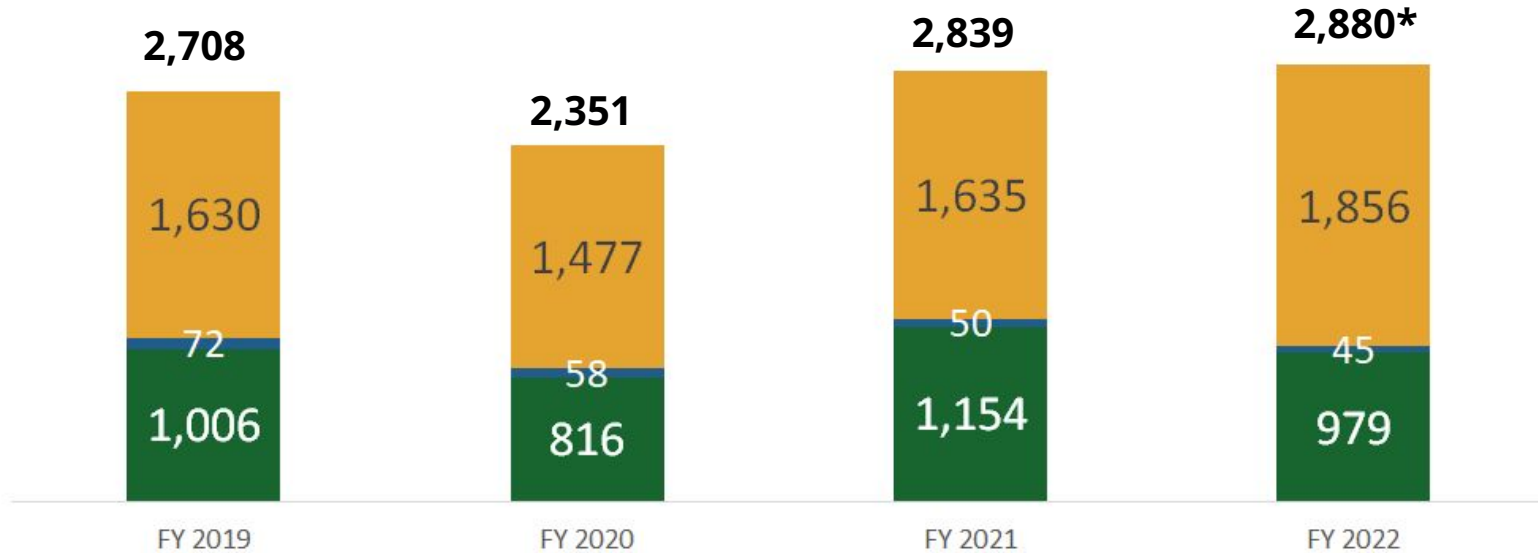

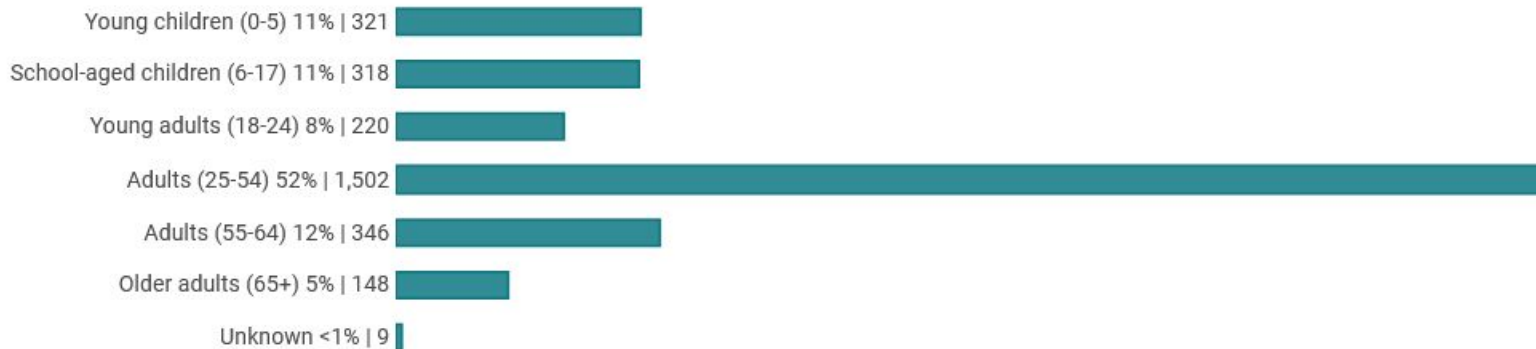

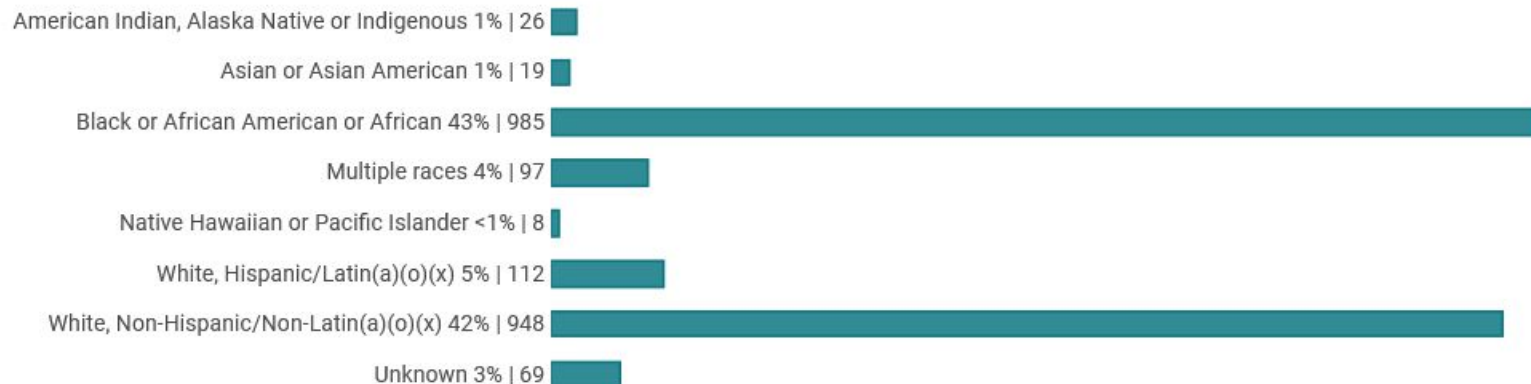

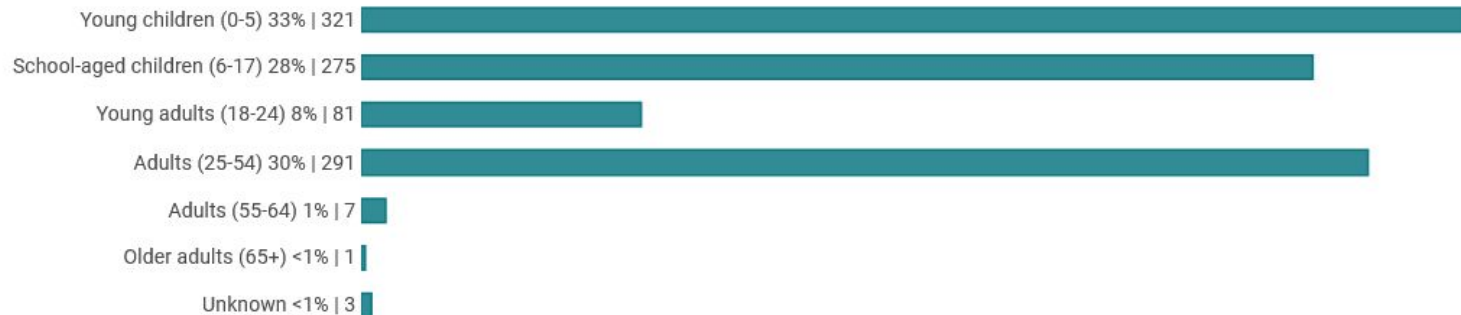

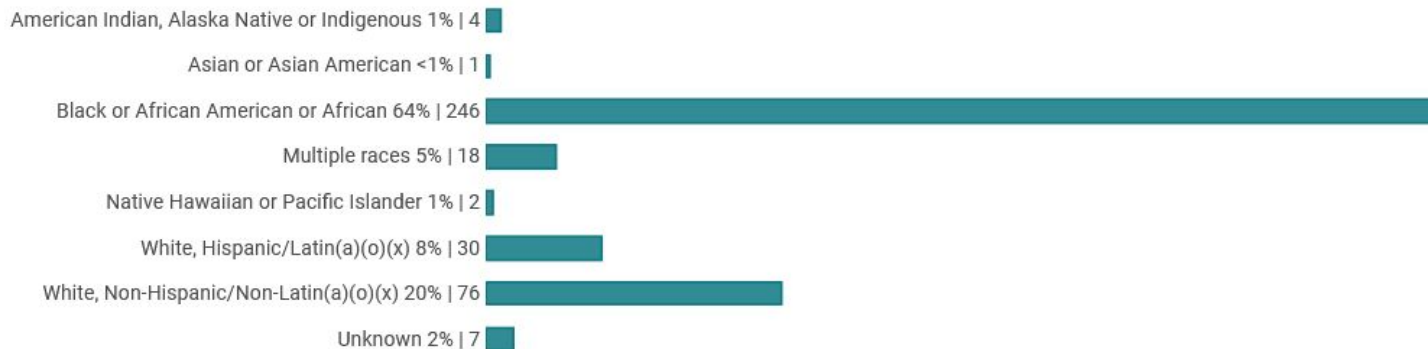

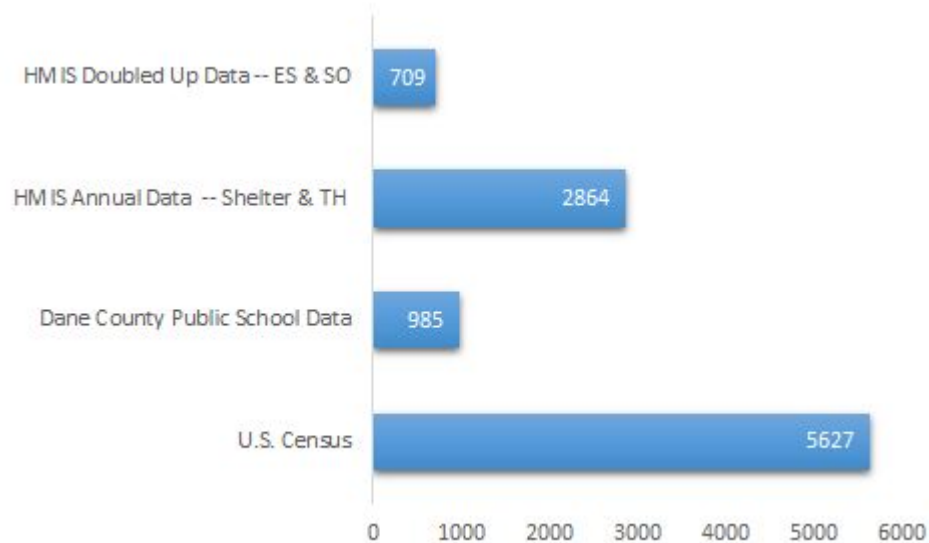

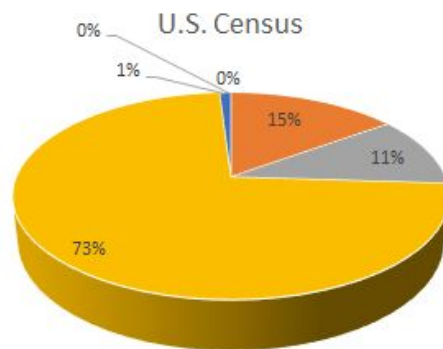

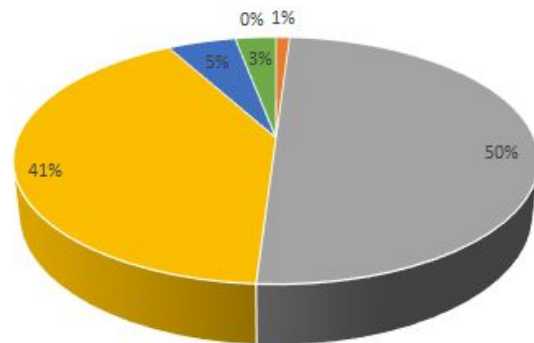

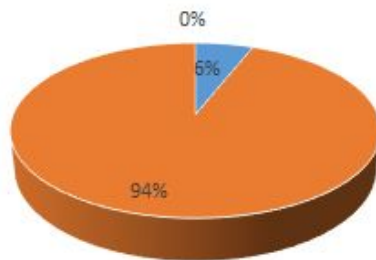

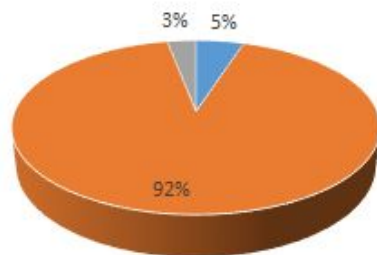

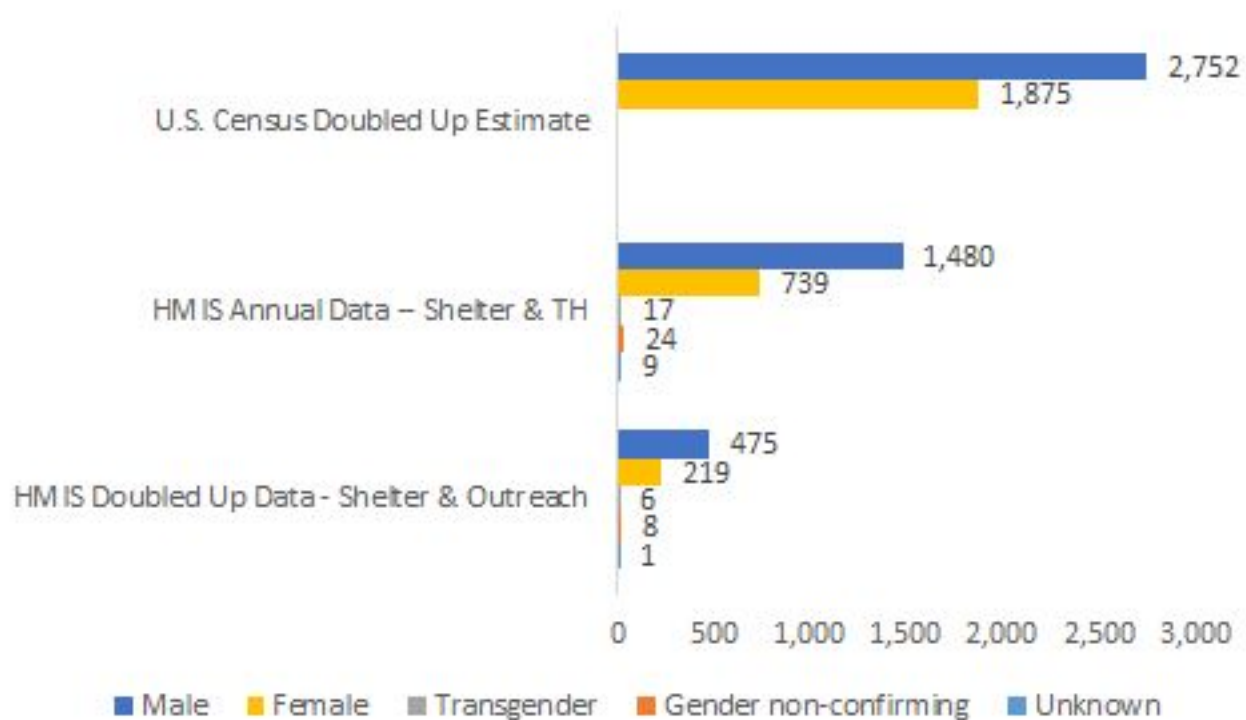

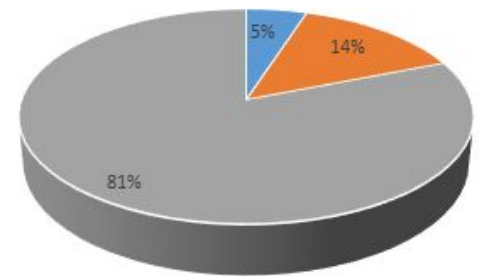

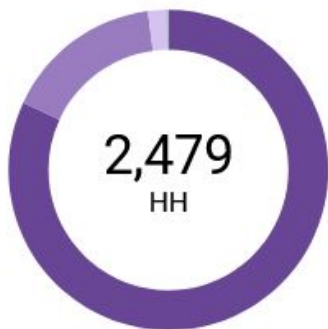

Households with Days Homeless and Days Homeless by Household Type

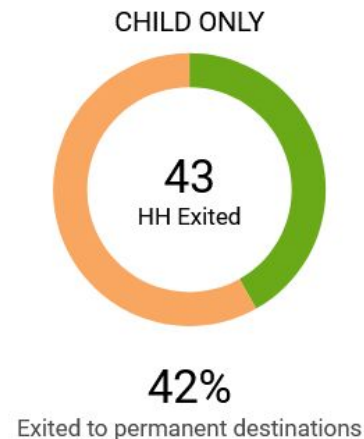
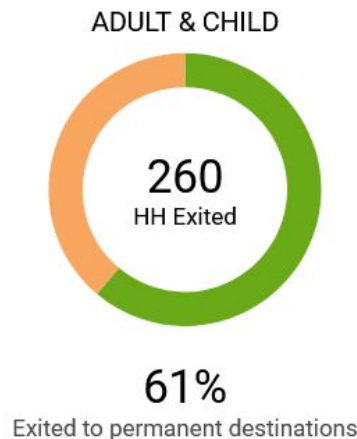
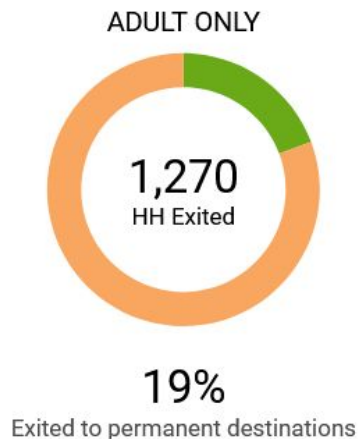
