8. 05351 Creation of an Operator License Subcommittee

Alderperson Olson reminded committee members of the discussion at the December ALRC meeting about streamlining the decision making on operator license applications, partly through the creation of an operator license subcommittee.

Ms. Rearick said a considerable amount of time would be saved through the pre-screening of applications by the Madison Police Department.

Alderperson Olson said it would be easier to talk about sensitive issues with a smaller subcommittee. Ms. Rearick said that a subcommittee may allow for less public humiliation of the applicants.

Alderperson Verveer mentioned that hardly any operator license applicants show up at the ALRC meetings, and that a subcommittee may have no appearances as well.

Madison has a quota of 399 Class B Combination Liquor & Beer licenses under state law. 55 of 74 Reserve licenses have been granted. 295 of 325 Grandfathered licenses have been granted. Taking into consideration the licenses recommended to Council to Grant at tonight's meeting, 49 Class B Combination licenses are currently available in the City of Madison.
