Tracy, thank you for your clarity of thought on this matter.

This is an excellent letter summarizing events in the most recent review period, and raises great concerns about the intentions and integrity of Mr. Carl and others involved in this project. Even at this late stage of engagement, Mr. Carl and colleagues have provided information that has been incomplete, inaccurate or deceptive. Further, the recent actions taken by Mr. Carl and colleagues in the Canopy building continue to be provocative as opposed to engaging.

I support the strong sentiment of the MNA Board and neighborhood residents that the ALRC should deny this request for an alcohol permit.

I further request that the City Building Codes Inspector be charged with providing a thorough analysis of any changes made by Mr. Carl and associates to the structure of the building, whether building permits were properly obtained when needed, and whether any safety, security or noise impacts have been introduced by these changes.

I would also request that an assessment of whether corrective actions or other legal sanctions or restrictions need to be applied by the City to address any concerns identified.
