The speeding problem on Elderberry

The Elderberry Neighborhood Association is working on bringing everyone together asap to work on the speeding problem on Elderberry Road. Challenges: 1) Who's doing it -- residents or cut-through drivers or both? 2) How do we slow it down -- without waiting for the city? Note that traffic entering Woodstone/Sauk Hts from the west is now coming from many directions -- Paragon Place, Mineral Pt. Rd., the Pioneer neighborhood and points south, as well as The Willows, Autumn Ridge, and points northwest of the latter two developments. This problem is only going to increase as Chapel View development begins near The Willows, Paragon's land is fully built out, and Elderberry is extended to serve Veridian's Eagle Trace. Please think about some immediate interventions. But for the long run, it's going to take more drastic measures -- stop signs, speed bumps, and whatever else we can throw at this problem to take pressure off the Woodstone/Sauk Hts segment of Elderberry Rd. AND PLEASE CONSIDER ATTENDING THE PLAN COMMISSION MEETING MONDAY AT 5:30 -- or writing the Plan Commission before Monday night, c/o Heather Stouder -- hstouder@cityofmadison.com, to keep pressing our point that "spreading traffic" through our neighborhood creates nightmares for residents. (Sadly, there's no point in asking our alderman for help.) Though we will lose at the Plan Commission meeting, we still have one last shot -- CITY COUNCIL on July 10.

I thought that your job is to represent the viewpoints of the people in your district, who are clearly concerned about their neighborhoods. If this type of representation were to happen in a company, you would have already been fired for not doing your job, Why are you not concerned about the above issues and what specific things are you going to go to solve this problem?
