#### Discussion:

- Suri: How many total grantees have there been?
- o Gauley: close to 50. Exhaustive list will be available in the report appendix
- Hidayat: SEED grant reviewer process has improved over time to reduce bias. What lead to the decision not to include SEED grant reviewers into the process?
- o Gauley: The primary reason to not interview MFPC members was because this effort was focused on the impacts of the grants. Questions of rubric or process could be examined in the future.
- o Reistad: Compares the current SEED grant impact evaluation to the difference between the 2018 Healthy Retail Access Program's process

evaluation compared to later impact evaluations of individual awards.

- o Hidayat: Consider impact of the decision-making process and how it can direct funds in certain ways, such as funding repeat organizations or width vs breadth.
- Day Farnsworth: Emphasize the ripple effects and positive impacts of the grants. A tiered structure would provide new opportunities for even greater impact.
- Reistad: Recommendations would come to staff. Staff is limited in implementing recommendations immediately.

Madison area wastewater showing increasing levels of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases. COVID-19 is at highest levels since end of march, although still much lower than winter surge.

Work progresses on an update to a report detailing food insecurity levels in Dane County. Anticipated completion is this fall.

Public market construction continues. Madison Public Market Foundation has hired a new director who will begin soon.
