






# Tree Canopy in Madison

- Race, income, and education are correlated to canopy variances in Madison.
- The most significant demographic-related predictor of tree canopy in 2015 and 2020 was housing tenure
- Property values and income were significant predictors for tree canopy
- Weak correlation between black population and tree canopy in 2015 and even weaker in 2020
- Highly educated people are more likely to benefit from tree cover
- Between 2015 and 2020 there is a small shift towards decreasing tree canopy inequalities



#### Tenets of How We Work

Community initiatives should be led by the community if they are going to benefit the community.

We partner with community-based organizations to help determine where trees should be located and host tree planting events.




