A. Description of Habitat Development or Design

The project consists of :

Forestry mowing to remove invasive brush at Olin~~g~~-Turville Park.

The Service, or a partner under written agreement, will:

Reimburse the City of Madison up to \$10,000.00 for forestry mowing work.

Monitor project progress and make management recommendations.

The Cooperator(s) will:

Submit a letter to the Wisconsin Private Lands Office requesting reimbursement after the forestry mowing contractor has been paid.

Provide copies of paid invoices upon request for reimbursement.

Fill out ACH form (attached) for reimbursement via electronic deposit or call the Wisconsin Private Lands Office administrative officer with this accounting information to set up a direct deposit account.

B. Description of Habitat Management Goals and Objectives for the Project:

The purpose of forestry mowing is to remove invasive brush thus improving overall ecosystem health. A high quality Oak Savanna and Woodland habitat exists bordered by lake shore which provides habitat for a large variety of wildlife and migratory birds. Furthermore, restoring Olin-Turnville park conservancy area will benefit the public by providing an excellent nature study area for generations to come.

Foliar spraying resprouts (where appropriate), interseeding natives, mowing, thinning, and invasive removal will have to continue as follow up to the forestry mowing effort to make this restoration a long term success. The City of Madison has invested a lot of time and effort in restoration at this site to date and will continue improving this conservancy area for years to come.
