Mall/Concourse food vendors.

A motion was made by Ald. Thomas, seconded by Schenkel, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT (15 VOTES REQUIRED) - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by acclamation.

Amending Section 9.13(6)(j)1.a. of the Madison General Ordinances to allow Merchant Vendors to display merchandise on the sidewalks on certain federal holidays.

This matter was RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT (15 VOTES REQUIRED) - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed.

 Create Ordinance 9.13/Regs language referring to Health Department standards for handling of grease and waste water.

> The Assistant City Attorney recommended that this reference be added to the Mall/ Concourse Food Vendor Application itself and not be included in Ordinance 9.13 or the Regulations Governing Vending on the State Street Mall/Capitol Concourse.
