SUBJECT: General Fund Revenue Report: 2nd Quarter 2008

We have prepared a mid-year, 2008 report to the Board of Estimates on the status of General Fund Revenues. The report includes additional detailed information regarding all types of Fines and Forfeitures, including Moving Violations, Uniform Citations (ordinance violations), and Parking Violations (please see attachments). This information will also be provided to the Pedestrian/Bicycle/Motor Vehicle Commission and the Transit and Parking Commission.

The report also includes an updated projection of 2008 revenues for the various categories based on a variety of factors. These are explained below:

<u>Taxes</u> Through the second quarter of 2008, we have accrued property taxes based on the December 2007 tax levy. There may be some further adjustments for tax collections for penalties and mobile home properties, and following additional tax appeals and adjustment of the reserve for delinquent property taxes, but our current projection forecasts property tax collections very close to those included in the adopted budget.

With regard to revenues derived from municipal service fees and payments in lieu of tax, or PILOTS, we are projecting a favorable variance of \$582,080 in revenue collections beyond those included in the budget, due primarily to an estimated increase of \$400,000 in the Madison Water Utility PILOT to reflect more accurate property valuations and mill rate projections (please see attached detail).

In total, we anticipate final 2008 tax collections to exceed those budgeted by \$582,000.

Intergovernmental Revenues Adopted 2008 budgeted revenues in this revenue category were based on the latest available projections from the state Department of Revenue. We have since received some payments and updated state DOR projections and have included these changes in our updated revenue projections. Most noteworthy is the State Payment for Municipal Services, where a recalculation by the State has resulted in a revenue loss of \$33,260, offset in part by an additional \$14,498 in Recycling Aid revenues.

<u>Licenses and Permits</u> Revenues for "Licenses" include: liquor license fees; dog, cat and bike licenses; and many fees associated with a host of licenses administered by the Clerk's Office. The majority of licensing activity and associated fee collections generally occurs in the first half of the year. Indeed, license collections posted to date are 242% of the total amount budgeted. However, many of these revenues will be reallocated elsewhere, most notably several hundred thousand dollars to the City-County Health Department for its associated license fee revenues, including restaurant inspection fees. In all, we project that actual license and fees collections should meet the revenues included in the budget.

With regard to Permits, while Madison has heretofore generally managed to weather the downturn in the new housing market, such is no longer the case. Both construction permit activity and associated building permit revenues are down markedly as compared to 2007 and prior years. Indeed, new single-family starts are down 56% through the first half of 2008 as compared to the same period in 2007. Further, 2007 building permit revenues were buttressed by robust activity in residential roofing repair as a result of hail damage. Such activity is unlikely to be replicated in 2008, further exacerbating a shortfall in revenues derived from building permits. Revenues posted through the first half of 2008 are tracking at 35% of the amount budgeted, and we do not anticipate a rebound. Our projection model indicates final 2008 revenues will fall between \$2.7M and \$3.5M; currently we are projecting final revenue collections of \$3.2M, which would represent a shortfall of \$1.45M as compared to the amount budgeted

## Fines and Forfeitures (Please see attached reports for detail.)

Moving Violations Total tickets written for Moving Violations through the second quarter of 2008 (9,680) are down slightly over the same period in 2007 (9,797). Interestingly, however, the number of speeding tickets issued has increased by 20%, from 2,505 through the second quarter in 2007 to 3,002 through the second quarter of 2008. All of this increased activity has occurred during the second quarter of this year, but MPD has indicated that the number of speeding tickets issued is not the product of an explicit operational allocation. In terms of revenues associated with Moving Violations, given that revenue collections through the first half of 2008 are tracking at about 40% of the budgeted amount, and that the overall volume of tickets has changed little from the previous year, we anticipate revenue collections similar to 2007, where we fell short of budgeted revenues by \$150,000.

Uniform Citations Through the second quarter of 2008, revenues of \$472,440 derived from Uniform Citations are 18% lower than the \$575,125 posted during the same period in 2007 and 5% higher than the \$448,144 posted during the same period in 2006. According to the Municipal Court Judge, the increased revenues in 2007 were largely the product of increased efforts by the Municipal Court to collect on unpaid forfeitures (and, perhaps, to a lesser extent, because of increases in bail amounts and forfeiture ranges for ordinance violations). In 2007, the Court began to utilize tax intercepts as a means to collect the unpaid forfeitures, and unpaid forfeitures from several years were placed on the program. Tax intercept collections have continued into 2008, but are generally now applied to more recent cases (as opposed to the previous backlog). The Judge has also indicated that the general economic downturn has resulted in a large increase in the number of persons requesting payment plans in order to pay off their forfeitures, and has also increased as well the number of persons who default on payments (who will then be placed on the next tax intercept cycle). All of these elements in conjunction suggest that we would expect some reduction in revenues associated with collection efforts in 2008, which indeed are borne out by the posted revenue figures.

Nonetheless, the revenues posted through mid-year 2008 are on track to exceed the \$900,000 level budgeted for the year. Indeed, because more citations are generally issued in the latter half of the year, the rate of revenue collections may increase as the year progresses, and actual revenue collections will likely exceed budget. We are therefore projecting year-end revenues that will exceed those included in the budget by \$50,000.

In terms of the number of citations issued, the Municipal Court reports that during the second quarter of 2008, cases disposed include a total of 3,803 adult non-traffic ordinance violation cases involving disorderly conduct, resisting arrest, building and health code violations, etc., and 571 juvenile non-traffic ordinance violation cases, many for underage alcohol-related offenses. During the same period in 2007, the Municipal Court reported 3,543 adult cases and 569 juvenile cases.

Parking Violations The reduction in overall parking ticket issuance that was manifested in 2007 as compared to previous years has continued into the current year. 2008 total second quarter tickets (80,374) for Parking Violations are tracking at nearly the same rate as the second quarter of 2007 (80,749) but are off nearly 20% or more as compared to the same period of the preceding four years. Among the many types of ticket violations, three of the largest ticket categories comprise the majority of the variance in 2007 and 2008 relative to prior years: Overtime 2-Hr. Zone (Not Metered), Expired Meter (On Street), and Alternate Side Parking, as shown in the chart below:

It's difficult to pinpoint why there has been a marked reduction in ticket-writing as compared to the previous several years. MPD has indicated that the reduction in tickets issued may likely be attributable to a combination of a continuing reduction in staff resources and increased compliance. In 2007 and again in 2008, MPD has been understaffed with regard to Parking Enforcement Officers due to temporary light-duty assignments, temporary family leave, and turnover. Additionally, parking ticket fines for Overtime 2-Hr. and Alternate Side Parking were increased by \$10 each effective at the start of 2007, which might translate to some degree of increased compliance, although this is speculative.

With regard to the revenues, assuming no significant operational change in the last few months of the year, we can anticipate a fairly substantial reduction in revenues derived from parking violations fines. Our current projection is that parking ticket revenues will fall short of those budgeted by \$500,000.

Charges for Services Of particular note here are anticipated revenues relating to Engineering Service Fees and Ambulance Fees. Engineering Service Fees are charged by the City Engineering Department to developers for design, inspection and legal fees for required public improvements. As development projects have slowed in conjunction with the softening real estate market, these fees have been reduced. Therefore, we project revenues from Engineering Service Fees will fall short of the budgeted amount by \$100,000. Ambulance Fees collections through June, 2008 are tracking at 57% of the budgeted level, in large measure a result of the continuing successful City efforts to recover payments for past-due billings. We expect these efforts to yield further positive results and are therefore projecting Ambulance Fee revenues of \$4,300,000, or \$450,000 greater than the amount budgeted.

Investment Income In 2006, the final Investment Income realized by the General Fund was a substantial \$5.74 million above the \$3 million budgeted due to several factors: the continued rise in interest rates; increased cash balances; a very favorable portfolio market-value adjustment; and, one additional month of interest accruals as required under accounting guidelines. In 2007, we increased the amount budgeted for investment income from \$3 million to \$4.5 million, based on the experience of 2006 and an expectation that interest rates would increase. Indeed, rates did increase, with a final annualized yield in 2007 of 4.94% as compared to the 2006 final yield of 4.504%. Investment earnings posted to the General Fund for 2007 were \$7,219,170, significantly above the budgeted amount. In addition, the General Fund realized a market gain on its portfolio of \$1,393,874, increasing the total amount of General Fund investment-derived income to \$8,613,044.

For 2008, we budgeted \$6,000,000 for investment income, with the assumption that rates would essentially hold steady. Now, through the second quarter of 2008, rates have trended downward, from the 2007 annualized yield of 4.94% to 3.848%. The interest rate decrease is fairly significant, and suggests that the final 2008 investment income earned will be somewhat less than that realized in 2007. This decline in the interest rates is partially mitigated by continued growth in daily cash balances, but we expect that final 2008 interest income will fall short of the amount included in the budget. Although the full year's investment income will be determined by continued variable rates and portfolio market-value adjustments as of yet unknown, we are projecting that 2008 interest income will be \$5,250,000, or \$750,000 less than is budgeted.

Investment earnings remain difficult to project, and we will be working closely with the City Treasurer over the next several months toward construction of a forecasting model that will help better determine the budget and projections for this category of revenues.

<u>Other Revenues</u> As of the second quarter of 2008, we are projecting revenue collections for this category to meet the budgeted levels.

In summary, projected revenue shortfalls of \$1,450,000 in Building Permits revenues, \$500,000 in Parking Ticket revenues, and \$750,000 in Investment Income are partially mitigated by an anticipated increase of \$580,000 in PILOT payments and \$450,000 in Ambulance collections, resulting in a total projected 2008 revenue shortfall of \$1.85 million.

We will continue to monitor and analyze the City's General Fund revenue status and will update the Board of Estimates and Council as appropriate.

# MADISON POLICE DEPARTMENT TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY -- QUARTERLY REPORT -- (2006--2008) SECOND QUARTER
