TREE **Spaeth's Alder** | *Alnus x spaethii*



Plant description

Spaeth's Alder is a rapid growing tree for streets, parks or landscapes. A nice alternative to Fraxinus pennsylvanica. Large leaves are serrated, coppery-purple in the spring and lustrous green in summer. Likes normal to moist soil but can tolerate dry conditions when established and will grow well in poor soils due to its nitrogen fixing ability. It is wind, salt and pollution tolerant. Widely used in Europe, it is a hybrid of Japanese Alder (A. japonica) and Caucasian Alder (A. subcordata) that is named after the botanist Franz Späth from Berlin, Germany.



Swedish Columnar Aspen (Populus triferecta') is probably the narrowest of the columnar trees that we grow. Rounded leaves suspended on long petioles trem with the faintest whisper of wind, creating same pleasant rustling sounds as the least of Quaking Aspen. Swedish Columnar regrows to a height of 40 feet and spread about 10 feet. A good substitute for Lombardy Poplar, it is seedless and har through <u>USDA Zone 2</u>. It also thrives in milder climates, as evidenced by the tal specimen growing in our arboretum.







The Sweet Street™ Linden presents beautiful glossy green leaves complimented by small, fragrant, yellow flowers. The glossy green color of this Linden tends to persist much longer than other linden varieties.

There are many notable characteristics of the Sweet StreetTM Linden, making it a desirable choice for many locations, including the narrow growth habit, sweet smelling flowers, small nutlets, and sweet nectar. You may also recognize this tree by its leaf structure- an asymmetrical base near the petiole; cordate shaped leaves, and acuminate tips with serrated margins – Common in Lindens and elms.



Yellowwood

Yellowwood is a medium- to large-sized tree, 30 to 50 feet high, with smooth bark, large hanging clusters of fragrant white flowers, and clear yellow fall color. Choose a yellowwood tree for excellent shade in a small- to medium-sized landscape. Note that the branches of the yellowwood are highly susceptible to ice storm damage. It was formerly known as *Cladrastis lutea*.
