Report to the Library Board December, 2008

NOTE CHANGE: The Board will meet at the new Sequoya Branch Library at 4:30 on December 1rst.

Agenda items for this meeting:

- Request Board approval for changes to the Library's meeting room policies, per the
 City Attorney's Office (in your packet). Changes to the Branch and Central Meeting
 Room Policies are highlighted in red; these were necessary to accommodate groups
 who wish to use our meeting rooms and need to enter into a signed contract to do so.
- Request Board approval for a Letter of Intent (enclosed) authorizing the purchase of a
 grey box from the Urban League of Greater Madison for a future new South Madison
 Branch in the redeveloped Villager Mall. This was approved by the Board of Estimates
 November 24 and is scheduled for Council approval on December 8.
- Request Board approval of the 2009 Dane County facilities agreement (enclosed); this
 annual agreement sets the rent for the space in the Central Library used by the Dane
 County Library Service including office space, collection space and parking.
- Report on the Central Library RFP timeline.
- Approval to authorize the preparation and funding for an analysis of the current Central Library building -- a necessary part of the decision-making process involving a new downtown library.
- Acceptance of the MPL Foundation's Capital Campaign Fundraising Goal Policy. (Enclosed.)
