

HOW TO CAST YOUR BALLOT AT A PARTISAN PRIMARY ELECTION

The purpose of this election is to decide who will represent each political party in the General Election in November. Therefore, at this election, the law **DOES NOT ALLOW YOU TO VOTE FOR CANDIDATES IN MORE THAN ONE POLITICAL PARTY.**

To cast your ballot correctly, please follow these instructions:

1. In the upper left-hand corner of the ballot (under “Party Preference”), connect the arrow for the party in which you wish to vote.
2. Within the political party you selected in Step One, you may vote for one, and only one, person for each of the offices listed.

WARNING:

- * If you mark the “Party Preference” and do not vote for any candidates, nothing on your ballot will count.
- * If you mark the “Party Preference” and vote for candidates in another party, only the votes under the “Party Preference” will count.
- * If you do not mark the “Party Preference” and vote in more than one political party, nothing on your ballot will count.
