

Dear Alder Conklin and Common Council Members,

I am a resident of District 9, represented by Alder Conklin and **I am in full, unequivocal support of agenda item 108 to call for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza**. My family has been directly impacted by the violence, death, apartheid conditions, censorship, dehumanization and power imbalance of Palestinians, as sponsored by Israel and a handful of Western democratic countries. We have family surviving in the occupied West Bank and have been in direct communication with those who are being oppressed by the inhumane conditions placed upon the Palestinian people both in the West Bank and more urgently in Gaza.

I am a mother of two small children (9 and 5) and an educator who has learned and taught about apartheid and genocides in South Africa, The Holocaust, Rwanda, Bosnia, Cambodia, Vietnam, Guatemala, Armenia, Residential Schooling, Sudan and the Congo. I have a BA in English and Media studies, and a Bachelor and Master of Education and am well versed on the history of Palestine and events leading up to genocides, ethnic cleansing and apartheid. I am also aware of the impact of propaganda and biased media narratives that dismiss those who are being oppressed, harmed and murdered at alarming rates. The harmful rhetoric, supported by the majority of elected officials, that I have heard against Palestinians over the last couple of months have made me afraid for my family, my children, innocent Palestinians and their allies and the future of this country and across the world.

Nothing excuses the lack of action, complicity and silence of our supposed democratic representatives at this time- it is literally the LEAST you can do to stand in support of a ceasefire. **I am begging you to support agenda 108**, calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. I ask this as a mother and someone who has always advocated for the rights, safety and dignity of all children. All children matter. Palestinian lives matter. Please support the ceasefire resolution at tonight's city council meeting. I am writing to you to express my wholehearted support of the [resolution](#) that will come in front of you tomorrow calling for a ceasefire in Gaza.

In the events during and since October 7th, a horrific loss of Palestinian and Israeli lives has occurred at the hands of Hamas's vigilante terrorism and the Israeli government's indiscriminate and criminal bombardment of the Gaza strip.

Well over [15,000 Palestinians](#), most of them women and children, have now been killed with thousands more missing under the rumble. As [reported](#) by the New York Times, experts say that even a conservative assessment of the Gaza casualty figures shows that the rate of death during Israel's assault has few precedents in this century.

What's more, [136](#) Israeli hostages have yet to be released by Hamas and the UNWRA has [observed](#) significant increases in communicable diseases in the area as the result of a massive internal displacement of about 1.2 million people. Gaza, akin now and before to an internment camp, is one of the most densely populated areas of the world — the continued systematic and relentless destruction of the occupied territory by the IDF has ushered in a horrific humanitarian crisis that will only worsen without a shift of the status quo.

For the long-term safety of both Israelis and Palestinians, a ceasefire is a vital first step in a long series of diplomatic processes that should, over time, guarantee the safety and statehood of all civilians going forward.

Disproportionality of violence, forced displacement, and a plethora of violations of international law continue to taint the legacy of the Israeli government and its military operations. In order to work toward appropriate and effective peace negotiations in Gaza, there must be an end to the constant violence which has already taken irreplaceable lives and intensified the lack of access to basic resources, freedoms, and infrastructure in the strip. When they were little girls, my grandmothers (both the Jewish and the Slavic one) barely survived the blockade of Leningrad. During this gruesome, multi-year siege, the Nazi army starved 1.5 million people to death - 80% of the city. I grew up hearing their stories and feeling their fear in my body. From a young age, I have wondered what I would do to prevent something like this from ever happening again.

Now is that moment. I am writing to urge you to call for a ceasefire in Gaza. As someone raised by survivors of xenophobic violence who, at times, resorted to boiling shoe leather and eating tree bark for sustenance, I am deeply affected by the stories that I hear of Palestinians resorting to drinking sea water, searching for their loved ones in the rubble. I am horrified by what is happening in Gaza's hospitals and streets and across the West Bank. This living nightmare has to end, and you have the power to help make that happen.

I hope that you call for a ceasefire as soon as possible. Every day, hour, and minute matters.

Thank you for your time, attention, and the important work that you do.

To all members of the Madison City Council, and to my own alder, **Bill Tishler**,

I am writing in support of the resolution calling for a ceasefire in Gaza. I am a member of the Madison-Rafah Sister City Project (MRSCP), but this letter is my own and contains my personal views.

I apologize for the length of this letter. This subject is very personal to me because in January 2005 my daughter and I visited Rafah in the Gaza Strip. I made this trip because MRSCP had raised money for a playground to be built for the children of Rafah and it looked like we had a brief window to get someone from our group into Gaza to see for ourselves what life was like there. The events occurred more than 18 years ago, and while I am doing my best to be as accurate as possible my memory is not perfect. What we experienced there cemented my views on human rights, and in particular, the rights of children. I am always appalled when I hear Palestinians referred to as sub-human or worse. The Palestinians I met on this trip were 100% human, no more, no less, and the children were 100% human children, deserving of the rights of children everywhere.

On January 31, our first full day in Rafah, our host, an agent for the al-Mezan Center for Human Rights received a call that a child at a school had been killed by live fire from an Israeli position on the Rafah border. This was "the fifth such fatal incident in the territory in the past two years." * Our first official stop in Rafah was the morgue, so my host could document the death. The child's name was **Noran Iyad Deeb**. She was 10 years old. Later that day we visited the hospital, where a second child who had been shot in the hand was being treated. Her name was **Aysha Isam El-Khatib**. We also visited the school where the shootings occurred. The schoolyard was mobbed with children waiting to attend the afternoon school session. Please remember their names as you decide on this resolution. I don't think I can ever forget their names or their images.**

During our stay in Rafah we met a lot of children in a lot of places. I folded origami birds for and with my host's nephews. We visited the site of the playground often. It was always mobbed with children, even before the equipment was unpacked and the first holes were dug. The children played like children everywhere. They laughed, they ran, they climbed equipment left on the ground. They pushed and shouted and fought a bit. They showed off their soccer and other skills, especially for my daughter, whom they found quite intriguing. And they showed me collections of seashells and bullets.

Then we visited schools and kindergartens. We were shown children's artwork. There were drawings of hearts and flowers. But most of the pictures depicted tanks and ambulances and bodies on the ground. Earlier that year the children had experienced Operation Rainbow, an Israeli incursion that destroyed homes, agricultural fields, infrastructure, and took many lives and injured many psyches. This is the world these children were born into and lived their whole lives in.

It has been 18 years since my trip to Gaza. During those 18 years the children I met have grown up in a world even worse than what we witnessed. In 2005, Israel forcibly removed the Jewish settlements from the Gaza Strip ending the internal "occupation" but beginning an external siege and blockade. Israel closely controls what can get in and out. They limit food aid to what is necessary to prevent starvation but leave the Gazans in permanent food insecurity. The water quality has deteriorated so that only 5% is considered potable. Medical supplies are inadequate and travel is restricted so that many people die for lack of treatment. Electricity is available at times, fuel for cooking and generators is limited. And there have been 5 major military incursions that repeatedly destroy homes and infrastructure and killed and injured countless 100% human people. The UN estimated that by 2020 that Gaza would be "unlivable." It is now 2023, and even before the current "war" Gaza was indeed "unlivable." I can't imagine what it is like to spend one's entire life in such a world, as the children I met in Rafah have. Crowd 2.3 million people into such a boiling pot, leave them there for years and eventually there will be an explosion. On October 7, there was an explosion.

In 2005 I fell in love with many children in Rafah. Those that are still alive are now adults who have lived their entire lives in some of the most appalling conditions in the world. They did nothing to deserve the world they were born into. They were born to parents who also have been deprived of basic human rights for their entire lives. Some of them may have children of their own now. They all deserve a better future.

The settlements in Gaza up to 2005 were illegal under international law. The siege and blockade of Gaza after the settlers left is an act of war under international law. Basically, the people of Gaza have lived under persistent war for all or most of their lives, a war they did not start.

Please vote to pass this resolution. A permanent ceasefire that is backed up by the rest of the world is a small but necessary step in the right direction. Humanitarian aid that does more than keep people alive is temporary but necessary fix, and must be given until Gaza can be self sufficient. Recognition that Palestinians are 100% human deserving of 100% of the rights of other people is a must. Only then can there be a real peace in Israel/Palestine.

I will remember the names **Noran Iyad Deeb** and **Aysha Isam El-Khatib** forever. Please say their names once more.

I would appreciate a response from you, especially from my alder, Bill Tishler.

As for mitigating circumstances, I was floored. How can there be mitigating circumstances to shooting at a schoolyard from 800 meters? Did a child throw a rock? Make a lewd gesture? Did the soldier have a headache? This attitude is common. Israel must be innocent, and all violence directed at Palestinians is deserved.
