This letter shall serve as confirmation of your request for an informal hearing, regarding the denial of your public housing application.

The hearing has been scheduled for **Monday, March 20, 2006, at 1:00 p.m.**, at our West Management Office, located at 540 W. Olin Avenue, in room 200, with Angela Grim.

Your application was denied for negative behavior, illegal drug activity or criminal behaviors based on information we received from your arrest and/or conviction records. Therefore, you will need to bring written evidence that the information CDA obtained from these sources is inaccurate. It may be necessary to have fingerprints taken by the Madison Police Department, in order to confirm with the FBI that indeed a mistake was made in your identity, regarding your arrest and/or conviction records.

If you do not attend the hearing, as scheduled, and do not contact our office prior to the hearing time and date, your application will be denied and your name will be removed from the waiting list and you will waive your right to a hearing. Arriving more than 15 minutes late of your scheduled appointment will result in cancellation of the hearing. *Hearings will only be rescheduled for verifiable medical emergencies.* If you need an interpreter, materials in alternate formats, or other accommodations to access this service, activity or program, please contact the Admission Supervisor at 267-8709 / TTD 264-9290.
