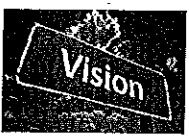

CDD Funding Process Study's Three Primary Goals

1. Identify and articulate clear policy goals and objectives
2. Design a funding process that effectively and transparently allocates resources to achieve these goals
3. Support City and community stakeholder efforts to:
 - * strengthen neighborhoods
 - * address poverty, racial and social inequities
 - * Improve the quality of life of city residents

**Phase 1:
Discovery**

- Gather information from stakeholder to inform policy goals and objectives for city investments
- June 2014 through November 2014

FORWARD community investments

How is that going to be achieved?

**Phase 2:
Design**

- Develop a theory of change to guide new allocation process
- November 2014 through March 2015

FORWARD community investments

How is that going to be achieved?


**Phase 3:
Implementation**

- Following process design, facilitate support and assistance to guide implementation
- March 2015 through December 2015

Phase 2: Design	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Structured feedback and insights on progress
Phase 3: Implementation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CDD, nonprofit and funder capacity building, collaboration and implementation
